-'91 RRRR-ANOTHER RECORD BREAKER!

Did you catch that recent front page, color photo, story in the Western Express? My, my, aren't we getting big?!

For the 6th year in a row we broke our own previous records by raising a net profit of \$12,805. during last January's Rodeo.

Helping us produce that Rodeo was New Mexico Gay Rodeo Association who recieved 20% of the profits, and Utah Gay Rodeo Association, who recieved 10%. Our 70% cut was distributed as follows...

\$2,241. to the Lesbian and Gay Switchboard, and \$6,723. to Volunteers in Direct Aid (VIDA).

Special thanks goes to outgoing President Artie Michaelis, and Treasurer Tim Versluys, who helped current Board Members Dan Iversen, and Max Sutherland get those books all together.

Plans are already underway to again break our record in January of '92.

A ROSE IS A ROSE,





Ya know, some of us still don't feel like we have a firm grasp on... a tight hold on... the hard... facts of...

...Oh! Excuse us... lost in our own little fantasy world for a moment there... we're back now.

Some of us still don't feel like we have a firm grasp on... the differences between Unit Rodeos, and Major Rodeos. We're the ones at the Membership meetings, who turn to the bar and order another drink when these discussions come up, rather than face the rest of the Membership with blank stares on our faces.

Being confronted with having to list New Mexico's Unit Rodeo results, and realizing that those results didn't fit into the same format as the recently listed California Major Rodeo results, has forced us into getting a little education on the differences. We share it with you, mainly for the purpose of going through it one more time for our own benefit. Hope this works...

Our Major Rodeos have thirteen Events. Three of them are on Horsies (Barrel Racing, Pôle Bending, Etc..). Four of them are with Rough Stock (not Rough TRADE Dino Rosie, Rough STOCK, as in Bulls, and Steers, so calm yourself!). Three of them are Roping Events (Dino, we've warned you!), and the remaining three Events are Gay Rodeo's own "Camp Events", such as Goat Dressing, and the Wild Drag Race (show of hands here please... how many thought "Wild Drag" had something to do with former Miss IGRA Moosela?).

Anyway, at Major Rodeos, such as our own Roadrunner Regional in January, all thirteen events are held on each day.

Times for both days are totaled to determine not only the daily winners in each event, but also the overall winners for the weekend, who then recieve the buckles for best Man and Woman in each Event.

Are we all together so far? Good, now let's throw in some confusion...

Unit Rodeos are designed to be smaller, and therefore easier, and less costly, to put on. IGRA instituted the concept of Unit Rodeo for several reasons, but two main ones. First, our smaller Associations can "get their feet wet" by putting on a one day Unit Rodeo, when a major, weekend long, Rodeo might be a

bit much to start with. And second, as IGRA expands across the Country, Contestants were finding it increasingly difficult to be able to attend all the Major Rodeos. Smaller, and closer to home Unit Rodeos, allow our Contestants to continue to earn points towards the Finals, while saving the time and expense of traveling greater distances.

In one-day Unit Rodeos, seven Events are run, one time each. The Association producing the Rodeo has their choice of any seven Events. To keep down costs, as well as to make things more convenient, Associations would naturally choose to group together "like" Events, such as doing all four of the Rough Stock Events, then add a few others, such as Camp Events, to make the mandatory seven Event total.

A unit Two Rodeo then, would include the remaining six Events, and one Camp Event, repeated from the first Unit, to make the seven Event total. Got it?

Using Zia's Regional Unit Rodeos as an example... They held two separate Unit Rodeos, one each on Saturday and Sunday. Saturday's included seven Events. Sunday's included the remaining six Events, and they repeated the Wild Drag Race from Saturday to get their total of seven Events for that day. The Wild Drag Race, by the way, seems a natural to be the repeated Camp Event on a regular basis. It's nearly impossible to keep some of these boys out of their dresses for even one day!

Becoming clearer? One more "for instance"...

Say sometime down the road Phoenix and Tucson decided to co-host a Unit Rodeo. Phoenix could do seven Events on Saturday for a Unit one Rodeo. Then we'd all caravan down to Tucson for Sunday and their Unit two Rodeo. Their Rodeo would consist of the remaining six Events not covered in Phoenix the day before, and a repeat of Saturday's Wild Drag Race, to allow Larry "Reba" Jones a chance to don his frock on both days.

There! Now isn't this all much more understandable?!

Just as I thought. Let us now turn and face the bar. First round's on you.

On to the Rodeo Results!
