


'91 IGRA CONVENTION DECISIONS

Lots of things going on in Albuquerque the first weekend of August, as IGRA held their Annual Convention. Both on the Convention floor, and behind the scenes afterhours, but perhaps we'll cover the afterhours events later.

On the floor...

IGRA Expands...

Gay Rodeo expanded yet again as two new Associations were officially seated. The previously recognized Georgia and their South East Association (SEGRA), and the brand new Atlantic States Association which takes our organization all the way to the East Coast and includes our Nation's Capital, with the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia.

IGRA now includes 22 states Nationwide, plus Washington D.C.

And as we keep expanding ...

IGRA Divides...

It had to happen eventually folks. and will continue to need to happen as we grow even larger. We can't expect California Contestants to travel to Maryland to earn those Finals points, so more Divisions were in order. Lots of "discussions" over whether now was the time, and exactly how to set the Division boundries. It became obvious that either way the vote went, there would be upset delegates, so AGRA asked for a secret vote, to enable everyone to vote their conscience and not have to bow to peer pressure. Thanks to our own JEFF COON, sitting up front as the IGRA Treasurer, who repeatedly whispered that suggestion to our delegation.

Judging from the discussion we heard, it was the smaller Associations who ruled the vote with a decisive 51 - 17 vote for the new Divisions.

Boundries were set around existing Rodeos, and State Association groups. North/South dividing lines were used to enable winter/summer Rodeos to be held within each Division. Refer to the map in this issue for all the details. In our specific Division (AGRA is now in Division II) we've gained back New Mexico after a years absence, but lost California. We keep Utah, and add Colorado.

Divides & Separates?

No way, not this year anyway. Also causing quite a commotion was the proposal that Contestants competing outside of their Divisions not be eligible to recieve any monies, ribbons, or buckles (they're already ineligible to earn points towards the Finals at these Rodeos).

CGRA's WAYNE JAKINO led the discussion on this one, acknowledging that it was an unpopular proposal, which surely wouldn't pass, but that it was time to start thinking in this direction. The reason being that as we get more and more competing Contestants, we're holding longer and longer Rodeo days, losing some of our audience attention, and burning out our Volunteers and Contestants. All valid concerns, but as Wayne said, not this year. Not one vote went for this proposal, including any from CGRA.

United at Finals?

Shock of the weekend could have been at Friday's Finals Committee meeting, when Wichita announced that they'd lost their contracted Arena for October's Finals. Seems that word of the Rodeo somehow leaked out to the straight Press, resulting in an article in Wichita's main paper. Unfortunately, even that positive article was a tip-off to the Right-Wing Homophobes in Andover (the suburb where the Arena is actually located) who immediately started a hate campaign against it, and us. All the usual threats about never using the Arena again as the food and bathroom facilities would be ruined if they let us "Diseased Homosexuals" in. The Arena backed out on us.

Wichita assures us that the Finals will go on as planned, and are currently working on plans with the previous Arena's landowner for a possibly even better site, much closer to the Host Hotels.

And just in case there are any future problems as the dates get closer, how about a little luggage tip? Why don't we all pack a couple ACT-UP T-Shirts along with our Wranglers?

If certain segments of Wichita's population don't WANT to deal with several thousand happy and polite Rodeo Fans, then perhaps they NEED to deal with several thousand cranky Activists? Just a thought in passing as we watch the Anti-Abortionists causing scenes up there right now on our TV sets.

And Next Year's Finals?

AGRA won the bid! By acclamation! Course AGRA was also the only Association to bid on it, but that's beside the point. Plan on another great party to end the '92 Rodeo Circuit, on October 23rd - 25th, right here in Phoenix.

So Who Got Convention?

Well, not us. We can't be expected to win everything, though DAN IVERSEN did his best by checking all of our ballots to make sure we all followed Membership's instructions. So much for Democracy in action.

GREG from the Holiday Inn did a great job presenting our case, and our room rates would have been the cheapest, but it just wasn't meant to be.

San Antonio made an equally good case for their proposed site in Texas, but like us, not next year for them either.

Utah was up next with their presentation for Salt Lake City. Lots of information, salt water taffy, honey (the Beehive State, get it?), "Beyond the Zion Curtin" banners, and a fun video by their P.R. and Fundraising Director, KEVIN HILLMAN, featuring the rest of their crew, and the always outrageous MISS WILDA BEAST (who, by the way, was followed by applause and laughter everywhere she went all weekend). Another great job, again no cigar.

The North Star Association was up last, and took Convention '92 honors with their video presentation that began with the old MARY TYLER MOORE Show theme song, and ended with a blond "Mary" drag tossing her hat into the air. President FRANK BOHLANDER and the rest of North Star's delegates put together a fun, energetic presentation that swayed the Convention, and put them over the top on the first ballot. Saint Paul/Minneapolis will be the site, the first or second

DAVID ANAYA/MISS HOLLIE WOODS sure had a festive meeting of the Mr/Ms/Miss Committee, judging from the laughter emanating from the room, which interrupted us "oh so serious" delegates next door in the By-Laws Committee.

Was quite nervous making his presentation the next day before the entire Convention, but the humor still shone through. An evening of conversation and conversion commenced, explaining that the only IGRA Royalty really losing any time would be our current Trio, who were all for the change. The issue, and David, were again brought to the floor on Sunday, where it passed.

A minor sidelight, Royalty members such as HOLLIE and WILDA did such a wonderful job a serving coffee on the Convention floor, and during our meals, that there's a move underfoot to make this a permanent function of future Royalty Members at Conventions.

...Elections..

Three of the previous four IGRA Board Members are back for another term. New Mexico's BOB PIMENTEL as President, and our own JEFF COON as Treasurer, and RON TRUSLEY as Recording Secretary. IGRA's new Vice President is OGRA's SHERYL SCHELKUN.

Vice President's slot took forever to fill (would 87 votes be too much of an exageration?). Former V.P. DOUG WAGNER wouldn't let himself be nominated for re-election initially, due to concerns about being able to fufill his duties with a possible job transfer coming up. The transfer didn't come about at the last minute (Saturday night) so Doug allowed his name to be placed on the ballot Sunday, but by then the field of at least six candidates had the Convention vote so split, that nobody could get the mandatory minimum number of votes to win.

After much back and forth, and narrowing down of the field, Sheryl finally pulled through as the concensus candidate. All good people, should be a productive year for IGRA.

..Rodeos..

What do our Contestants have to look forward to next Season?

Well if we'd stayed in the same Division as last year, we would have added a Major Rodeo in San Francisco to our agendas. Since we switched Divisions, look at a trip to San Francisco as a vacation, and do it anyway.

In our own Division II, we'll have our Roadrunner Rodeo in January, Colorado's Rocky Mountain in July, and last year's New Mexico Unit, will be this year's Zia Major Rodeo in September. We're also looking at a couple of Units thrown in for good measure. Don't believe anything is set in concrete yet, but the talk is of a shared 2 Unit Rodeo between Colorado Springs, and our new Tucson Satellite Chapter. And don't forget, AGRA will once again host the IGRA Finals in October.

Who Pays for all This?

Well, as we all know, we pay for our own, plus a little more as our share to keep the over-all IGRA going. But more help is on the way, in the manner of International Sponsors. Miller Brewing, our only International Sponsor last year, is helping us out even more next year. Final dollar amounts will depend on the number of Rodeos held, but early indications are that they'll nearly double what we got from them the last Circuit Year, possibly as high as \$40,000. Talks are also underway with Marlboro Cigarettes and/or an overall sponsorship deal with the parent company of both, Phillip Morris (good thing the boycott is over with). Our local Miller Distributor, Shamrock, has been good enough to us over the past year to warrent a special IGRA Award at this year's Convention, which was presented to our local people at the just passed Unit Rodeo Awards Brunch.

There have been several successful ads for our Rodeos placed in the "Advocate" during the past couple seasons, which was started by AGRA, thank-you for asking. So now they're negotiating with us over a series of ads to cover our entire next year's Circuit. They're also putting together a special "Rodeo Fashion" section to hit the newstands in time for this year's Finals. Fashions will be provided by "Sheppler's" clothing stores, so guess who else we're talking to? "Sheppler's"/Denver has already agreed, and have submitted a proposal to their Corporate Offices.

Sent back to the table for further investigation was a proposal for an International Travel Agency to handle all of our Circuit's business. It was decided that at this time, each Association is probably getting better deals from their own local agencies.

ATLANTIC STATES


Officially seated at our Annual Convention was the new Atlantic States Gay Rodeo Association.

These concerns deserve answers, and since we can't get back to the writers directly, we thought we'd try to answer them through a "letters to the Editor" type format. Figured we'd have to do this eventually anyway, as every issue's delivery is followed by threats from HOLLIE WOODS to write a nasty letter to us, though we can't figure out why, it's our own personal opinion that we treat her like GOD. This month's "letter"...

Dear Cute, Adorable, Charming, Little Editor in the Garanimals Wranglers Outfit, ... (Since we're setting up the format,

we can refer to ourself any way we please) ...

"Read about "Mother" - If you read the Board Member by-laws, it states if a Board Member misses 3 meetings he/she will be dismissed from position, why is it acceptable for "Mother" to have a "sit-in" and still hold post?"

Dear Survey Respondent,

The operative word in the By-Laws section that you refer to (pg. 10, Article VI, Removal From Office) is "... MAY be removed from office...".

In discussing the "3 consecutive meeting" clause, the current Board felt that that too was to give them a wider latitude and more options in making sure that each individual Board area was functioning properly.

For instance, if the Corresponding Secretary was missing numerous meetings, but still getting out the newsletter, he could claim that he was still doing his job. Missing so many meetings though, could result in a less than correct, and up-to-date newsletter, in which case the Board could invoke the "3 consecutive meetings" clause to help get that area back in order.

In RON ERICKSON's area, the Board feels

that there are no such problems. Ron is already well into the planning needed for January's Rodeo. The set has been designed, sound and lighting ordered, and a general schedule of events is already in place. In addition, his Dance & Entertainment Committee remains intact, with each individual person working on their own particular area of expertise. With JOE RUBIO "sitting-in" at Board Meetings, Ron and the Board will not only have constant up-to-date information flowing back and forth, but will also have an excellent contact to keep the Mr/Ms/Miss Contest going smoothly.

As the activities inside the hall are so important to the overall "draw" of our January Rodeos, the Board feels that changing a Board Member two-thirds of the way through the year could have been a mistake, and certainly would have been an unecessary hassle since "Mother" has volunteered to return in January to complete the Rodeo, and finish up his term.

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"BITS"
