# KITCHEN COUNT

Did you know that in Argentina a burger is boiled and served with a fried egg on top of a piece of pumpernickel bread and that in Germany ground beef is mixed with pieces of wet bread, onions, mustard and an egg, while Koreans add kimchee, a mixture of pickled cabbage, and very hot peppers? No matter what recipe you use, all of them cook faster when you puncture them before cooking. Before you buy the meat, make sure you check your options: Reindeer meat from Finland, for example, may be contaminated by radiation due to the 1986 Chernobyl nuclear disaster. And compare the price, as boneless cuts are usually cheaper per serving!

Ingredients: 6 tablespoons honey, 1 teaspoon curry, 1 teaspoon pepper, 1 tearosemary, 2 tablespoons vinegar, 2 teadrops Tabasco, and 2 shots of Jack Daniel's. this new column. And before you go crazy over your burger, try the recipe of this month,

small bottle ketchup, 1 tablespoon paprika, 1 spoon marjoram, 1 teaspoon thyme, 1 teaspoon spoons salt, 1 lemon, 8 cloves of garlic, a few

First you mix the honey and ketchup, then you add the ground garlic, salt, and the rest of the spices. Jack Daniel's is added last. It is recommended to use a hand mixer! The sauce tastes best when it is left in the fridge for a few hours. That give the ingredients time to settle and unfold. Also, you may want to marinade the meat and let it sit over night. The best results, however, are achieved if the meat is coated repeatedly while on the grill!
