A Founding Member...

in Memory of Gordon John Woima by Bruce Chudobiak

The first ARGRA Trustee to the International Gay Rodeo Association, Mr. Gordon John Woima passed away on February 23, 2007. Gordon was born on March 26, 1951 in Eckville, AB, the last child of Walter and Ellen Woima. Gord was raised on a farm near Sylvan Lake until age 9 when his father passed away and his mother moved them to Calgary. Gord attended various schools in Calgary and began a degree program at the University of Calgary. This did not suit Gord's well being so he left school and took a job with Canada Post where he remained until retiring in 2004.

Gord was an avid musician, playing instruments such as piano, guitar and drums. He loved to sing as was witness to his karaoke performance, at Trax and the Texas Lounge.

In 1989 Gord along with his partner, Bruce Chudobiak and a few other friends began the Calgary Lesbian and Gay Political Action Guild (CLAGPAG) to gain equal rights for members of the gay, lesbian, and transgender communities.

In 1991, a poster was put up by Richard O-Sullivan seeking people interested in starting up a Gay Rodeo in Calgary. Originally, Gord

was not in favour of joining but Bruce prevailed and as was Gord's way in life, he threw himself into the project. It was not uncommon to see Gord out at night continually chatting up the rodeo concept to anyone who would listen, and a few who didn't want to hear this. Late 1991, the Alberta Gay Rodeo Association was formed with the intent of creating a gay rodeo here in Calgary. In 1993, Gord and Bruce traveled to Billings Mont. to see the International Gay Rodeo Association and determine if we wanted to join. Buy this time, the Association had already put on a trial rodeo, the "infamous" Canadian National Gay Rodeo (CNGR). Gord's attendance at the IGRA convention convinced him that this was the way to go so we anted up the money, provided the membership list and we became the first association recognized outside of the United States. Gord continued to work for the associations principles serving as President, Vice President and Trustee until 1997. Gord always felt close to the association and provided his vision and spirit to improve the community in whatever way he could. He will be sorely missed by all his friends and acquaintances he made through the rodeo association.


