NOTES OF THANKS

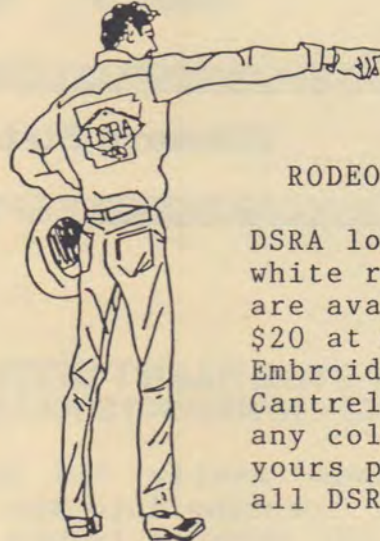



CONVENTION '90

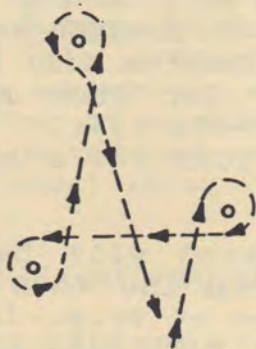
The IGRA National Convention was held July 27-29 in Wichita, Kansas. The weekend started with preliminary committee meetings Friday morning. DSRA delegation spent most of its time with Rodeo Growth, International Sponsorship, International Dance, and IGRA Royalty committees.

The actual convention started Saturday morning. One of the first orders of business was the seating of the new associations. In addition to DSRA, North Star (Minnesota & Wisconsin), Tri-State (Ohio, Indiana & Kentucky), and Northwest (Washington & Oregon) were seated.

The International Dance Contest was held Friday and Saturday night in conjunction with the Convention. The female teams sponsored by FLOYD'S in Long Beach, California, won both the amateur and pro-am divisions.

The major item to come out of the convention is the establishment of Unit 1 & 2 Rodeos. (See related story, "Rodeo? Its Time DSRA!"). It was a productive, informative convention, and we are ready to put all the new plans into action.

**RODEO EVENTS
BARREL RACING**



The name of this horse racing contest is derived from the brightly colored barrels around which the riders run a triangular pattern in the rodeo arena. Barrel racers are allowed a running start into the arena as they head toward the triangular pattern of 3 barrels. Charging at full speed, they must rein their horses in, spin around the first barrel and spring straight across the arena to the second. Repeating the spin around the second barrel, they spur their horses back to speed as they angle toward the last barrel set at the far end of the arena. A circle around the third barrel begins the full speed charge straight down the arena toward the start/finish line. Tipping over a barrel during the maneuvering will cost the barrel race a 5 second penalty and they can be disqualified for running an incorrect pattern. Electronic timers are used to record elapsed time between crossing the start/finish line in hundredths of a second. With well trained, strong willed horses and fiercely competitive contestants, one or two hundredths of a second are often all that separates the final standings in this rodeo event.

1990 IGRA RODEO FINALS

The Finals Rodeo will be held this year in Phoenix, Arizona, on October 5-7, 1990. All events will be held at the El Lienzo Charro Rodeo Grounds. The headquarters hotel is the Days Inn, 602-264-9290. Other hotels serving the rodeo are the Holiday Inn, 602-248-0222, and the Quality Inn, 602-257-0801. Please mention the IGRA rodeo for the best rates. 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RODEO, A POSSIBILITY FOR DSRA!

One of the best things to come out of the 1990 IGRA convention in Wichita, Kansas, was the creation of the Unit Rodeo. This is particularly true for new associations, like the DSRA. The convention approved one or more associations conducting small one day rodeos that would be the equivalent of 25% of a major rodeo. Any association may request approval from the IGRA Board to conduct a Unit Rodeo. Each Unit will have 7 of the usual 13 events. The points, prize money, events and IGRA requirements will stay the same.

The DSRA and NSGRA delegates from Minnesota have agreed to pursue getting their members to do a Unit Rodeo in April and May 1991. The DSRA would do the Unit 1 Rodeo on Saturday April 13th and NSGRA would do the Unit 2 Rodeo on Saturday May 11th.

If the DSRA membership approves, we would do all the horse events (i.e., barrels, flags, poles, chute roping, team roping), the wild drag race and goat dressing. All the rough stock events would be done by the NSGRA in the Unit 2 Rodeo. Is this possible? YES! With good planning and some hard work, this could be more fun than you would ever imagine.

HOUSTON RODEO

November 7 - 9 are the dates of the 7th Annual Texas Gay Rodeo. The site will be the Sam Houston Coliseum in Houston and the Hyatt Regency Houston will be the host hotel. For room reservations call 713-654-1234. Be sure to mention TGRA for a special room rate.

The weekend will begin Friday night with the TGRA Rodeo Kick Off Dance at 8p.m. in the Hyatt Imperial Ballroom. The rodeo, parties, and dances will run through the weekend, and topping it all off will be the Rodeo Awards Dance Sunday night.

Many DSRA members have already made arrangements to go to Houston. Don't be the only cowboy or cowgirl left in town! DSRA is organizing a bus trip to the rodeo, for up to 47 members. 35 spaces have already been reserved on the bus for this trip. Make your plans now to go to Houston. HPWA - RELIEVING THE FINANCIAL PAINS OF AIDS

Central Arkansas has many support groups and service organizations that are working to help those in our community with a variety of needs. Each month, the Lariat will profile one of these groups; letting you know who they are, what they do, and most importantly, how we can help each other.

This month's focus is on a non-profit charitable organization established in 1988 to assist individuals who suffer from AIDS and AIDS-related diseases. What is unique about Helping Persons With AIDS (HPWA) is that it is concerned with the financial needs of PWA's. Based in Little Rock, HPWA issues direct financial payments for medical bills, nursing care, pharmacy bills and living expenses to Arkansans who meet its criteria for assistance. With the rising costs of medical care and drugs, the need for this type of organization is great.

HPWA began when a group of concerned individuals met in February of 1988, determined to form an organization dedicated to providing assistance to those in need. Funding for the group is derived from volunteers from all walks of life who raise monies through fund-raisers and pledge drives. No member of the HPWA staff receives compensation for his/her services. The Board of Directors is composed of professionals and lay members from all fields including education, medicine, law, business and theology.

Because HPWA is vitally concerned with the accountability of its fund-raising and disbursement efforts, applicants for financial assistance must meet certain criteria. For information about how to receive assistance from HPWA, call 501-666-6900. All information concerning cases is kept strictly confidential.

HPWA is constantly in need of volunteers and funding. An open invitation is extended for anyone to become involved in its ongoing efforts to minimize the burden that AIDS imposes on our society. You can make a difference!

AIDS FOUNDATION CONFERENCE

The Arkansas AIDS Foundation has announced details of their annual conference to be held September 7th and 8th at the UAMS campus. The theme of the conference will be "AIDS: A Test of Human Values." It will explore the way in which societies have responded to grave threats of pestilence and disease, and the moral and ethical considerations of modern day epidemics.

The keynote speaker will be author Randy Shilts. He is a journalist for the San Francisco Chronicle and is the author of And the Band Played On. There will also be a pictorial essay by nationally known photographer, Andrew Kilgore. Other speakers will include Dr. Allan Brands of the University of North Carolina, and Dr. Mary Winkler of UT at Galveston. The foundation is inviting representatives of major Arkansas institutions for a panel discussion on Saturday.

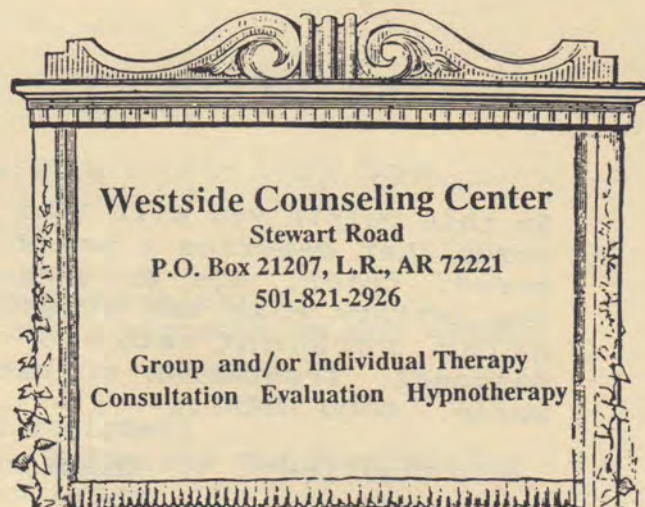
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DON AND PHILIP HOST CELEBRATION

Rule #16: Mr., Ms., MISS D.S.R.A.

(Competition shall be held within thirty (30) days following I.G.R.A. finals)

SECTION I: ASSOCIATION CONTROL RULES

A. Entertainment Committee

1. Carries main responsibility for contest
 - a. Location of talent and dress competition and awards
 - b. MC's/Announcers
 - c. All forms necessary
 - d. All necessary props and equipment
2. Will coordinate with Public Relations and Fundraising for advertising
3. Will coordinate with Membership Committee for eligibility of contestants
4. Will coordinate addition of any entertainment to enhance this major event
5. Will provide judges for competition

B. Public Relations Committee

1. Work with entertainment committee on advertising
2. Complete all advertising for this major event

D. Membership Committee

1. Assist entertainment Committee in validation eligibility of contestants

E. D.S.R.A. President will announce the winners at time set by the D.S.R.A. Board of Directors

SECTION II: JUDGES

A. Selection of Judges

1. Five shall be provided by Entertainment Committee
 - a. Three (3) from out of state
 - b. Two (2) from in state
2. No Judge shall be a member of D.S.R.A.

B. Entertainment Committee is responsible for providing guidelines for judging to the judges

C. Once selected and instructed, judges will be responsible to the President of D.S.R.A. or the President's designated representative who will coordinate the judges during the competition

D. All judges names will be submitted to D.S.R.A. BOD for final approval

E. Announcement of any portion of the results of the judging is prohibited until the conclusion of all parts of the competition

SECTION III: MR., MS., & MISS D.S.R.A.

General Rules-Guidelines (to be printed and handed out with application forms)

A. Contestants (all three (3) categories)

1. An Active Member of D.S.R.A. (dues current)
2. Sign agreement with D.S.R.A. which states; "In the

event I win the title of Mr., Ms., or Miss:

- a. I agree to represent the association for one (1) year
 - b. I agree to compete in the Mr., Ms., & Miss I.G.R.A. Competition
 - c. I acknowledge and understand that competing and winning represents a possible two (2) year commitment
 - d. I know and understand that I must raise a minimum of \$500.00 for a 501-C3 charity as approved by the D.S.R.A. BOD to retain my title
- B. Titles to be awarded are:
1. Mr. D.S.R.A.
 2. 1st Runner-up -- Mr. D.S.R.A.
 3. 2nd Runner-up -- Mr. D.S.R.A.
 4. Ms. D.S.R.A.
 5. 1st Runner-up -- Ms. D.S.R.A.
 6. 2nd Runner-up -- Ms. D.S.R.A.
 7. Miss D.S.R.A.
 8. 1st Runner-up -- Miss D.S.R.A.
 9. 2nd Runner-up -- Miss D.S.R.A.
- C. Entry Deadlines
1. Entries must be in to the Board of D.S.R.A. at least seven (7) days prior to the competition
- D. Judging and Point Awards
1. Areas of Judging
 - a. Mr. & Ms. Contestants will be judged in personality and western dress
 - b. Miss Contestants will be judged in personality, western dress, and entertainment
 - c. Scores for each area of competition, for each contestant, will be accumulated and contestant earning most points will receive title
 - d. Western dress and entertainment will be open to the public. Personality will be closed to the public
 2. Point Value
 - a. Entertainment - 25 points
 - b. Western Wear - 25 points
 - c. Personality - 25 points
- E. Competition Guidelines
1. Personal interview
 - a. Interviews before panel of judges who will be looking at:
 1. Poise
 2. Confidence
 3. Familiarity with I.G.R.A. and D.S.R.A. and their benefits to the Community
 4. Casual western dress (Miss candidates will appear in male attire)
 2. Western Wear Competition
 - a. Contestants will model contemporary western fashions (i.e. as one would find in today's western catalogs or western wear store)
 - b. Specifically, Miss shall not wear stage costumes
 3. Miss Talent Competition
 - a. Presentation of "Show Routine"
 1. Country/Western in nature
 2. Five (5) minute time limit (exceeding the time limit will result in a five(5) point per minute or portion of a minute penalty)
 3. Presentation shall be done solo
 - b. Audience will be asked not to tip during competition
 - c. Music selection must be taped (only number on the tape) and cued
