



The Right Reverend John Shelby Spong, D.D., Bishop of Newark, is the most published member of the House of Bishops of the Episcopal Church in the United States, and probably its most well known. The author of fourteen books, Bishop Spong is known by many as one of the first bishops to ordain a non-celibate, openly gay man. 
