A Continuing series on the 10 most common sports injuries....

Muscle Pull: A muscle pull accurs when a sudden force stretches the muscle fibers beyond their capacity. Beside warming up and stretching, there's not much you can do to prevent this common injury, though it's relitively easy to treat. Immediately icing the injured area for 20 minutes as often as possible will relax the muscles and relieve the spasm until the sawelling subsides, usually within a day or two. As muscles heal they shorten, which can make them more prone to pulls the next time around. So you'll need to gently stretch teh area as soon as you can tolerate it. It may take up to a week for a pulled calf muscle to regain it's normal range of motion and up to a month for a pulled hamstring.
