



It's Cold & Flu Season Again...

About Colds...The coomon cold is an inflammation of the membranes of the nose, throat, pharynx, or tonsils. colds occur throughout the year, but are most common in late winter and early spring. Experts do not all agree on how colds are spread; that is, whether the viruses are more efficiently transmitted through the air via sneezing and coughing, by hand-to-hand contact, or by touching something. there fore, it makes sense to be cautious when colds are prevalent, or if you are very susceptible.

*Wash your hands often during cold season

*Try to keep from touching your nose, eyes, or mouth

*Avoid sharing cups, glasses, and eating utensils

*Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing & ask family members to do so, and to wash their hands

*Eat and sleep properly

If you cntract a cold despite your best efforts;

*Get extra rest

*Double or triple your fluid intake. (At least 8 glasses of water)

*Humidify your bedroom for comfort ot take hot showers

*Acetaminophen or Aspirin may help to reduce fever and body aches
*Medications such as decongestants and antihistamines may relieve cold
symptoms. Check with your health care provider before taking these
drugs if you have any other health conditions

*A cold cannot be cured by anitibiotics, but occasionally the complications

of a cold may be.

About the Flu....Influenza, or the flu, is a viral illness which commonly occurs in the winter. The flu has symptoms similar to a cold, but they come on more suddently. The most characteristic flu symptom include weakness and fatigue, muscle aches, headaches, fever, sneezing, and a runny nose.





RODEO ED

Howdy folks! Hope you all made it to the Buckout at Miesner's last month. The state was happy to pick up the entire tab for this event. All you education chairs remember to contact me if you are having an education event to see if there are ways that the state can assist you.

San Diego has all new timing equipment including 2 timing computers and 2 timing displays. We will be having a training session for their use and set up some time in March. If you are interested in this, please contact me and I'll let you know when we are having the session. (Rick @(619)782-3275).

Last time we talked about how to become a judge on the rodeo circuit. This time Γ d like to talk about 2 other certified official positions which you may want to try for - Chute Coordinator and Arena Director.

These positions are probably the most strenuous positions and require a time commitment second only to the Rodeo Secretary.

CHUTE COORDINATOR

The Chute Coordinator is responsible for all the activities in and around the bucking and roping chutes. This includes staff, contestants, and livestock. This means you must oversee all the activities going on in those areas making sure that all runs smoothly, and most importantly, safely. You are responsible for making sure that all rodeo rules in that area are followed and enforced. If you think you might want to work towards a Chute Coordinator position, you might want to volunteer at the next rodeo and try out some of the chute duties. When you are sure you want to do it, get in touch with the coordinator for the Chute Coordinators - Jeanne McLeod. She will probably want you to fill out a form showing everything you have done so far. It is important to do this early. It is also a good idea to let chute coordinators in your area know you are interested so that they can help you to get the experience that you still need.

Look in the back of the I.G.R.A. rule book for a full description of the Chute Coordinator certification program - page 55. Basic requirements are as follows:

- Work on the chute staff for a minimum of 5 sanctioned rodeos
- Perform rigging assistance and spotting
- Animal loading
- Contestant line-up (paperwork)
- · Gates camp, roping, rough stock, and bulls
- Work 2 rodeos as assistant Chute Coordinator in the bucking chutes
- · Work 2 rodeos as assistant Chute Coordinator in the roping chutes
- · Complete a Chute Coordinators Seminar (See last month's newsletter for dates)
- Once certification committee thinks you are ready, work with Jeanne to set you
 up for a Rookie position. As a Rookie, you will act as the Chute Coordinator
 during the rodeo, but are actually an assistant to a real certified Chute
 Coordinator who 'acts' as your assistant.
- If you completed your Rookie to the satisfaction of the certification committee, you will be recommended for certification at the next I.G.R.A. board meeting.

Your local Chute Coordinators are Erin Eaton, Sue Downing and myself. If you have any questions and would like to talk with either of us before chatting with Jeanne, please feel free to do so.

ARENA DIRECTOR:

The Arena Director is responsible for managing the staff and operation of the actual rodeo. They also work with the host chapter Rodeo Director before the rodeo to take care of staffing, event lineups, arena equipment and supplies, and any other issues that may need to be discussed. In most cases, the Arena Director has more experience and knowledge about the actual operation of the rodeo itself than does the Rodeo Director. We are very fortunate to have the Arena Director Coordinator right here in California, our very own Erin Eaton. If you think you might be interested in this program, give Erin a call right away and get started.

One of the most important pre-requisites to becoming an Arena Director, is to be certified as a Chute Coordinator first. So if you think you might want to be an Arena Director some day, get started on the Chute Coordinator program now. Part of the reasoning for this is that if something happens to the Chute Coordinator during the rodeo, you are responsible for managing the Chute Crew as well.

The Arena Director's responsibilities include the arena setup. Fortunately for us, most of the rodeos in the west that we attend have the Kelly Krew run by our own Kelly Poorman. The Kelly Krew makes an Arena Director's job much easier. There are some rodeos that don't have Kelly Krew, or a suitable replacement, so you must also know the ins and outs of setting up the arena for all events. Doing some time with the Kelly Krew can definitely fill this requirement.

For more information on the Arena Director Certification program, look in the back of your I.G.R.A. rule book, page 54. Basic requirements are:

- Be an I.G.R.A. Certified Chute Coordinator
- Assist in coordination of horse and camp events
- Serve as Assistant Arena Director in at least 3 rodeos
- Complete and Arena Directors Seminar
- Complete a Chute Coordinator Seminar

Your local Arena Directors are Erin Eaton and myself, give us a call if you need more information.




