

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



New for Rodeo '97: A new location!

There's a big change coming for the Los Angeles Rodeo. Next year, we'll be moving to a beautiful new facility at the Hansen Dam Equestrian Center.

Chapter members, meeting in June at Hansen Dam, approved the proposed relocation of the rodeo after 12 years at the Los Angeles Equestrian Center.

The Hansen Dam facility is about 15 minutes north of the Burbank Airport Hilton, which will continue as our host hotel. The facility — in the city of Lake View Terrace — was designed by the same planner who designed the Los Angeles Equestrian Center as well as the center that will be used for this year's Olympic Games in Atlanta.

The overall site is beautiful with fantastic views of the foothills. It should be a terrific location with lots of room to grow — and make our next dozen rodeos as great as the last 12!

► Why move?

he Los Angeles Equestrian Center, built for the 1984 Olympic Games, has been a great location for the annual L.A. Rodeo for a dozen years. So why mess with a good thing and move?

Easy:

The Hansen Dam Equestrian Center has a number of things going for it. As chapter members found out when they visited in June:

- It is a larger site in a beautiful, parklike setting.
- There are trees for shade and grass for relaxing.
- Dancing and entertainment areas can move back outside.
- The facility will allow food and beverage rights to the chapter (a little more work, a lot more money!).
- Festival and food booths, the dancing tent and entertainment areas will be on a grassy area (like the one that was so popular at Palm Springs' first rodeo — no more dust!)
- Fencing will be limited, providing an open feeling throughout the site.
- Parking will be less expensive (though not free).
- We'll probably be able to reduce ticket costs.
- We can still have two arenas.
- It's only minutes by freeway from the Burbank Airport Hilton, which will remain our host hotel.

G.S.G.R.A. Convention 96

Another GSGRA convention is behind us. The weekend of May 4-5, GSGRA members from all over California convened in Stateline, Nev., for the first-ever GSGRA convention held outside California. It was fun and roductive (don't be surprised if next year's convention is in Nevada again!)

Although much was accomplished, few issues generated any controversy. The highlight of the meeting was the welcoming of our sixth chapter, the new Capital Crossroads Chapter, based in Sacramento. The new chapter had an eager group of delegates present, and the other chapters welcomed them eagerly.

Among the major issues was a decision to change the allocation of some membership-dues money. Members pay \$40 a year, \$5 of which had been going back to that member's chapter. Instead, the \$5 will now go to the state exclusively to fund projects of direct benefit to members, like buckouts and gymkhanas. GSGRA has been more active recently in sponsoring such events, and the allocation will allow that level of activity to continue.

A number of issues were discussed in preparation for the IGRA convention in late July. Vince Coco will present our opinions regarding the present IGRA insurance policy, which has not been a benefit to California. A number of rodeo rule changes were discussed

as well; the delegation will be prepared to handle whatever proposals are discussed at convention.

The IGRA delegation will be comprised of Phil Baldwin, Roger Bergmann, Lloyd Carr-Flores, Vince Coco, Michael DeYonker, David Medzerian, Joe Olney, Brad Roberts, Craig Rouse and RIck Washburn.

The convention then elected the GSGRA 1996-97 executive board: Craig Rouse, president; Phil Baldwin, administrative vice president; Clint Johnson, vice president for rodeo operations; Larry Rose, treasurer; and Tim Parker, secretary.

Finally, the new board and the new state board representatives met. Among their topics was the schedule of meetings for the year:

- -- July 20, Fresno (which will coincide with the Central Sierra Chapter's big summer fund-raiser).
- -- Nov. 2, Palm Springs which will coincide with the 1997 GSGRA Royalty competition).
- -- Feb. 10, Los Angeles

The 1997 state convention will occur between April 15 and May 15, with the specific date and site to be announced.

For the third year in a row, all convention business was concluded in one day (albeit a long day!), leaving folks to enjoy Stateline or head to Las Vegas for a night of fun.


