Last call (almost) for Royalty contestants

Your 1995-96 GSGRA royalty have been a busy bunch. But because their terms were 16 months long instead of the usual 12, they're ready for a rest. Lucky for those sash queens, the 1997 Royalty Competition is just around the corner.

The contest is scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 2, in Palm Springs, to coincide with the fall meeting of the state board. We'll be holding the annual competition for Mr., Miss and Ms. GSGRA (yes, we do have a Ms. position — we just didn't have any candidates last year).

Contestants compete in the categories of Interview, Western Wear, Entertainment, Horsemanship and Public Presentation (an on-stage question).

But time is running out! Entries must be postmarked by Oct. 1. And you'll have to get started on your fund-raising — you have to raise at least \$500 for a 501(c)3 charity — and brush up on your horsemanship, entertainment and interview skills (we know you're all naturals at the Western Wear part).

The winners will represent GSGRA for the following year at rodeos and rodeorelated events in and out of state. This year's winners also can represent California in IGRA Royalty competition in November 1997. California's done well lately: Ms. GSGRA 1994 Amy Griffin was first runner-up to Ms. IGRA 1995; Mr. GSGRA 1995-96 David Medzerian is also first runner-up to Mr. IGRA 1996; and Miss GSGRA 1995-96 Sheba McEntired will compete next month in Albuquerque for the title of Miss IGRA 1997.


The Orange Country pride parade went well with a great turn out. Oor Association was well represented with a fine showing of both two and four legged animals.

A special thanks to David Smith and Sunnie Rose for all their hard work


