

All contestants receive a copy of the I.G.R.A. rule book so please do not ask for bylaws just for rodeo rules.

The G.S.G.R.A. bylaws are many pages long and the I.G.R.A. bylaws are even longer. Printing and postage costs at more than \$10.00 per set prohibit general distribution. We ask that you only request the bylaws you actually need and that you enclose three dollars if you are requesting the bylaws of only one organization and five dollars if you are requesting the bylaws of both organizations. Remember that the bylaws of I.G.R.A. are for the International Rodeo Season and are amended only once a year at the International Convention. This means that the current I.G.R.A. bylaws will serve until the end of October and the revised bylaws from this years convention will take effect on November 1, Checks should be made payable to G.S.G.R.A. No cash please. All requests for copies of the bylaws will be honored with or without payment.




