
New Beginning....

Tips from you Health & Safety Committee...

Brad Roberts, Rodeo Medic

My neck and upper back feel tired and sore at the end of the day. What Should I do?

TIPS: This type of discomfort can be caused by poor posture, prolonged posture and stress. In order to decrease your pain you need to address these three areas:

Correct your posture; this will require stretching of tight structures, changing old habits and adapting your workstation to accommodate your new posture. Most people have rounded shoulders and a forward head. To correct this, pull your shoulders down and back. Then slide your chin back so that your earlobes are line up over your shoulders (chin tuck). Initially this will feel foreign, but with lots of practice it can become a habit. Some exercises to help promote good posture are; Pull arm down, lean ear to opposite shoulder and hold for 10 seconds, lean into corner bracing yourself with you arms for 10 seconds, chin tuck and hold for 5 seconds and stretch up to the ceiling with hands together. Pull elbows to back pockets and hold for 5 seconds.

Decrease prolonged posture – take a break every 30 minutes to do gentle stretching, shift your position, or get up and walk around the room.

Decrease Stress – Work on time management, set realistic goals, begin a fitness program, and learn to recognize muscle tension and reduce it.

If your discomfort continues, if you have numbness or tingling into your arms or if you notice weakness, contact your doctor

News from the IGRA Trustee...

UNITED AIRLINES DISCOUNTS: As you may know, IGRA has signed a sponsorship agreement for 1998 with United. The deal, to sponsor convention and finals, doesn't prevent individual rodeos from having their own airline sponsors.

And it does mean group discounts when attending 1998 IGRA rodeos and convention if you use their Special Meeting Desk to book the reservations. You can earn a 5 percent discount off the lowest applicable fare, including First Class, or 10 percent off the mid-week coach fare. If you buy your ticket at least 60 days before your travel date, you get an additional 5 percent off. Call (or have your travel agent call) 800-521-4041 and refer to Meeting Plus® ID code 524SR. United warns that seats may be limited so you should make your plans early.

RULE INTERPRETATIONS: Contestants, along with your entry forms for the second half of the rodeo year you received notice of two rule interpretations made

by the trustees at our April meeting in Little Rock. These interpretations addressed how the drag must be mounted in Wild Drag, and an issue involving rerides in Broncs. Neither is a big deal, but be sure to review these interpretations before you compete again.

BABY BULLS: The trustees agreed to let ASGRA use adolescent bulls for Steer Riding at this year's Atlantic Stampede. These "baby bulls" have been ridden previously and are comparable to our usual steers.

ASGRA needed the waiver because they had problems finding the appropriate size of steer for Steer Riding, because of the time of year and the shortage of rodeo stock on the East Coast.

MANY THANKS: Lastly, thanks for your support in electing me to a full term as your trustee to IGRA. It has been my privilege to represent GSGRA in finishing up Vince Coco's term over the past year, and I look forward to doing the same in a full-length trustee term.
