Avoid Animal Bites

Each year animals, many of which are pets, bite millions of people. Listed here are some ways you and your family can avoid animal bites;

Never tease or pet unfamiliar animals

Leave mother animals alone when they are with their babies

Never enter an unfamiliar dog's territory (its yard, home, or car).

Don't handle or feed wild animals

If a bite breaks the skin, wash the area with soap and water. If you notice any swelling, redness, or pus draining from the cut, call your doctor immediately. Also, check with your doctor about getting a tetanus booster shot. If you were bitten by a pet, ask its owner for proof of a rabies immunization.

NEWS from the 1998 IGRA Convention

There is plenty of news out of the IGRA convention, which was held the first weekend of August.

MILLER SPONSORSHIP OVER AT THE END OF 1998:

As you probably have beard,
Miller Brewing
Co. has chosen to end its national sponsorship of IGRA at the end of 1998. This is a corporate



business decision; Miller is instead putting its support of gay and lesbian events into its local and regional representatives.

This of course means that each California rodeo is out \$5,500. But this also presents great opportunities. Individual rodeos can now seek sponsorships from any beer company. And rodeos may be able to get even more locally than the national IGRA contract provided (for instance, before the national Miller contract was in place, L.A. did much better with its local distributor).

The Miller representatives at the convention were very helpful in providing contact names and useful information on getting sponsorships — not just from Miller but from any company.

DISCUSSIONS CONTINUE FOR 1999 UNITED SPONSORSHIP:

United had a representative at convention who also provided a lot of useful information. As you know, IGRA has a sponsorship deal with United for 1998, one that applies to convention and finals and doesn't prevent individual rodeos from having their own airline sponsors. Discussions are continuing with United for a 1999 contract; both IGRA and United are aware that GSGRA insists that such a contract must not be mandatory on rodeohosting groups.


TRUSTEES MAKE TWO RULE INTERPRETATIONS:

Two rule interpretations came from the trustees, interpretations which take effect right away.

The first involved chute dogging. IGRA rules allow a contestant to begin "dogging" only after crossing the line, but there was no description of what "dogging" actually is. The judges clarified this by saying that dogging is any action — other than just controlling the steer — done in an effort to "dog" the steer. You'll be fine as long as you wait until the whistle to start "dogging."

The other rule interpretation applies to rodeo hosts. It was noted that in goat dressing, some rodeos tie the goats to a weighted object (like a concrete block) while others are using stakes in the ground. IGRA rules state that, for safety reasons, the goat must be tied to a

weight and not a stake. So if you're planning on throwing an IGRA rodeo anytime soon, be sure your goats are tied to a weight and not a stake.



RODEO-RULE CHANGES ON THE HORIZON FOR NOV. 1: Most all decisions at convention take effect with the new rodeo year, which begins Nov. 1 after 1998 finals are over. There were a number of small changes, ones you might not even notice. There were two changes you won't be able to miss:

Starting in November, rodeos are no longer required to hold a Saturday morning contestant meeting. This will be a relief to many — but it puts a lot more responsibility on contestants: You'll have to make sure you know exactly what changes might have been made when you're at registration on Friday and throughout the whole rodeo. The other significant change was to the Wild Drag Race, which will look very different. Here's how it will work beginning with the new

rodeo year. When the chute opens, the team will drag the steer across the far line. Once the steer is across the line, that's when the drag will mount the steer. Then, the team must get the steer back across the line (toward the chute); time stops when that happens. The thinking of the delegates was that it would make for a more exciting and more competitive event.

Remember, the two rule changes

FINALS, CONVENTION
SCHEDULED THROUGH 2000:
Previously the 1998 finals already
was set for Phoenix and the 1999
finals set for Little Rock. At
convention, delegates awarded the
2000 Finals to Albuquerque.

For conventions, you know that the 1999 will be hosted by GSGRA in Long Beach. Our friends in Nevada were awarded the 2000 convention in Las Vegas. And there's a benefit for us, too: NGRA has agreed to help us at the 1999 convention in exchange for our helping them at the 2000 convention.

OFFICERS RE-ELECTED, BUT TWO-YEAR TERMS AHEAD: The 1997-98 IGRA board all were re-elected to their posts (KGRA's Linda Frazier is president, NMGRA's Robb Sisneros is vice president, AGRA's Ron Trusley is secretary and CGRA's David Hill is treasurer). But in a major change, delegates decided that by the year 2000 IGRA officers will be elected to two-year terms.



CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR CHAMPION DANCE TEAMS: As always, GSGRA dance teams set the pace for the rest of IGRA. Congratulations to our teams and their awards:

In Division 2: San Diego's *Tiy* Ocasio Torres and Paul Casey, champions

In Division 4: San Diego's Daniel Greene and Mark Balmer, third place (Congratulations, too, Karalyn Brindel and Dee Wallace for their second-place performance in Division 2. The team, from the Bay Area, represented NGRA in the competition.)

ONE FEWER ASSOCIATION AS MONTANA LEAVES IGRA: IGRA now has 20 member associations with the departure of Montana's Big Sky Gay Rodeo Association. BSGRA's contributions to IGRA included hosting the annual IGRA convention in 1993 and hosting their own rodeo

in Billings in 1996.


