

# CONVENTION DELEGATES TO BE SELECTED AT B.O.D. MEETING

The February BOD in San Diego will see the selection of our Delegate Team for the Annual IGRA Convention to be held in Long Beach later this year. This year we will be following a new process to select our delegate and all those interested are urged to attend and participate. We will be selecting our delegates based on their knowledge and experience in specific key areas and each delegate will then be our primary spokesperson in that area. The areas of expertise are (1) By-laws and Standing Rules, (2) Rodeo Production, (3) Contestant/Standing Rules and (4) Dance / Royalty. In this new process, the Trustee and State President are automatically elected to lead the delegation. The Board will then select a delegate for each area of expertise and two alternates who's qualifications will best round out the skill, knowledge and experience of the team as a whole.

For people on the go, few foods are as portable as fruit. Most fruits need little or no preparation. Plus, the best fruits are packed with nutrients and fiber, not with fat and calories. You should eat at least two servings of fruit each day. Here are some ways to fit more fruit into your diet:

Drink 100 percent fruit juice. Such as orange, grapefruit, pineapple, or tomato juice, with your meals.

Put berries on our cereal or dessert.
Stash dried fruits, such as apricots and dates, in your car or desk for quick snacks.
Stock up on fruit that is canned in its own juice so that you always have fruit available.

Blend a shake of 1 cup fresh berries, ½ banana, ¼ cup orange juice, ¼ cup vanilla nonfat yogurt, and 1-cup ice cubes.


