The chapter board meeting and the state convention were held concurrently, enabling your chapter board to effectively get several items of business out of the way while proposing several rules changes designed to help the state organization run more smoothly and effectively on behalf of members statewide. Of interest to chapter members is the dates approved for application to IGRA for chapter rodeos in 2000 (April 14-16), 2001 (April 27-29) and 2002 (April 26-28). At the conclusion of the convention, many of the attendees attended a memorial service for Eloy Galindo, our beloved member who had passed away recently. The service was packed with GSGRA members, friends of Eloy and Roger, and many members of Eloy's and Roger's families. The size of the turnout was ample testimony to the esteem with which Eloy was held as a member of our chapter and a rodeo official.

This year the IGRA convention will be held in Long Beach on July 29-Aug. 1. The convention is being hosted by the entire statewide GSGRA organization, but the Greater Los Angeles Chapter is especially proud to welcome everyone to our beautiful corner of the state.

Elections set for 1999-2000 officers

They are July 17th and 18th to be hosted by the Bay Area Chapter (location to be announced) and November 20th and 21st, to be hosted by the Capital Crossroads chapter. The royalty contest will be held in conjunction with the November meeting.

The February meeting will be on the 5th, and will be hosted by your chapter. It will be held at The Village in Los Angeles.

Your chapter will also host the GSGRA state convention on May 6 & 7, 2000. The state dance competition will be held in conjunction with the state convention next year.


