

The ride will begin at Sunset Ranch, 3400 N. Beachwood Dr. in Los Feliz. It takes about two hours to make it to the restaurant. We'll stop for dinner there, then make the two hour ride back to the ranch.

To get to Sunset Ranch, from the Hollywood Freeway (101) south, take the

Franklin Blvd. exit. Go east on Franklin to Beachwood, north (left) on Beachwood to the ranch. From the 101 north, take the Gower St. exit, and keep right at the split.

If you're planning on bringing your own horse, you *must* check with Sue or Connie if you haven't already done so -- space for your trailer is extremely limited. In fact, car pooling is best, too, if you're planning on coming with a friend.

Plan to be at the ranch by 5:00 PM. No later or you might get left behind!

# From the Editor's Desk... Tears of Gratitude

A vote taken at the IGRA cenvention, held in Long Beach at the end of July, brought a tear of gratitude to your editor's eye. I even had to leave the convention floor to regain my composure.

The vote was whether or not to approve dividing prize money into up to three divisional payouts in horse speed events, based on times turned in. This change was sought by the horse competitors, and was opposed largely by some of the more experienced competitors, particularly those who compete both in horse and other events. The vote approved the inclusion of the divisional payout rule. And that's where I come in.

I know I'm not a candidate to ride the PRCA circuit. I'm painfully aware of that, and I know I never will be. After all, I'm fifty years old, I've only been out for a few years, and interested in gay rodeo for only a couple of those. At my age, I'll probably never be a first-division rider, and I know that that it's darned unlikely I'll ever be wealthy enough to own a first-division horse. But I'd still like to compete. I'd still like to be a real, competing part of this thing we call gay rodeo.

But what incentive is there for me to trailer a horse hundreds of miles to a rodeo, spend hundreds of dollars in hotel costs, stall and entry fees, knowing full well that any prize money I'd like to win is going to go straight into the pocket of a much more competitive cowboy - one who's had a lot of breaks I never had?

And haven't we've all heard stories of such cowboys who don't really care one whit about the buckles they've won, but are really there only for the cash they know they can take away from the weaker competitors? This new rule addresses that problem. It means that it's possible for a less competitive cowboy such as myself to come home with *something* - a small check, but some prize money nonetheless. A small reward for endless hours of practice and a long trailering trip.

The cowboys of the IGRA are my friends, and are the only family I really have these days. And now, with this vote, I have one more reason to make my home with them in the IGRA. That's why the tear of gratitude. Thanks, ladies and fellas, I really appreciate it. And I owe you one!
