

Important Chapter Meeting - Be There!

The decision with regards to whether Rodeo 16 will be held in April is about to be made.

The upcoming chapter meeting will assess the success of the recent fundraising efforts and determine whether we can proceed with next year's rodeo.

In order for us to produce our rodeo next year, we have to put together the \$7,000 positive bank balance required before the state will approve our budget and sanction our rodeo. Our chapter leadership will go over the results of our efforts and the decision will be made at the meeting whether we will bid for approval of our rodeo plans for next April. The deadline for the decision is the state board meeting in Sacramento in November.

"This is a very important meeting," said Chapter President David Medzerian, "because I believe this is when we'll decide whether we can go ahead with the April 2000 rodeo." The meeting will be at 10 AM on Sunday, Oct. 10 at the Westin Long Beach Hotel, 333 Ocean Blvd., Long Beach.




