

CONTINUATION OF RODEO HISTORY

In November, Gay rodeo was firmly established in Texas with the staging of the First Annual Texas Gay rodeo a few miles outside Houston.

In December, the Arizona Gay Rodeo Association (AGRA) leaped to life in Phoenix. Later, in September, the First Convention of IGRA was held in Denver with the four founding states in attendance. The Oklahoma Gay Rodeo Association (OGRA) was formally seated as the fifth member.

1986: Arizona's first and highly successful Gay rodeo took place in January at the El Lienzo Charro Rodeo Grounds in Phoenix.

In August, Oklahoma produced its first rodeo, ending the first circuit year on a highly successful note.

Three more Gay rodeo associations were seated at the Second Annual IGRA Convention in Denver: Kansas (KGRA), Missouri (MGRA) and New Mexico (NMGRA). The right to hold the first IGRA finals was awarded to California; they were held in Hayward in September

1987. IGRA's second president, Les Krambeal, took the oath of office at the conclusion of the convention.

1987: The feature felt most painfully this year was the glut of contestants. The IGRA officials quickly realized the problem and resolved to address it at the next convention. Another important event that year was the seating of the Silver State Gay Rodeo Association (SSGRA).



JOCKSTRAPS...

Too much jiggling around during exercise can bruise your testicles or your epididymis, the tube that caries your sperm. Though usually harmless, this condition can hurt more than taking a knee or hoof. So always batten down before you run or compete (and using a protective cup) - but there's no need to squeeze yourself into an old supporter. Snug cotton briefs or Lycra athletic shorts will support your testicles as well as a jockstrap during exercise and running.
