

Standing Rules of GSGRA Greater San Diego Chapter

SECTION 1. REGULAR MONTHLY MEETINGS:

- The Chapter will hold a regular monthly meeting to be held the first week of every month with the exception of November and those dates that fall on a National Holiday.
 - The day of the week will be voted on at the general membership meeting in December.
 - The date must be agreed on by a majority of the membership present.
 - The Chapter will hold a rodeo roundtable monthly with the exception of the month before a rodeo production.
- The day of the week will be decided by the VP of Rodeo operations upon the advisement of the rodeo roundtable.
- The VP of Rodeo Operations will chair the meeting.
- In the event that the VP of Rodeo Operations is not present the Rodeo Director will chair the meeting.

SECTION 2: CHAPTER CHAIR DUTIES

The chapter committee chairs will report to chapter officers as directed by the chapter president.

- ARCHIVES: To maintain and collect items for GSGRA-SD'S history.
- BY-LAWS: To assist the chapter membership in applying for changes to the standing rules and bylaws. To update and maintain the chapter by laws and standing rules. To maintain/update GSGRA & IGRA manuals: standing rules and by-laws.
- CHAPTER FUNDRAISING: To plan and coordinate fundraisers for chapter expenses.
- STATE REPRESENTATIVES: To attend all state board meetings and the state convention. To
 update chapter members on GSGRA state business. To be a liaison between the chapter and GSGRA
 board of directors.
- FINANCES: To audit GSGRA-GSDC'S treasurer's records at least annually.
- EDUCATION: To develop and direct educational projects. The training should be useful in the
 participation of rodeo.
- PUBLICITY/MEDIA RELATIONS: Inform the press and public about upcoming rodeo events. To be GSGRA-GSDC's liaison with the media.
- COMMUNITY OUTREACH: To serve as a liaison between GSGRA-GSDC and other community organizations. To inform the chapter membership of upcoming community events.
- MEMBERSHIP: To recruit new members through membership drives. This includes participation in community events, i.e. pride and rodeo events.
- EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES: To plan and coordinate non-fundraising events for the benefit of GSGRA-GSDC members.
- MOBILITY AND LOGISTICS: To be responsible for GSGRA-GSDC'S equipment trailer. To
 arrange contracts with other rodeos for the use of the trailer and its contents. To be aware of the
 trailer's contents, location and condition. To ensure the trailer's registration is kept current.
- MERCHANDISE: To oversee the production and sale of chapter related merchandise. Coordinate
 with the rodeo merchandise coordinator.
- MERCHANDISE/MEMBERSHIP DISCOUNT: To contact businesses for GSGRA-GSDC members.
 To inform membership of discounts available.
- SYSTEM SUPPORT: To coordinate with the office manager the maintenance and updating of GSGRA-GSDC computers.
- NEWSLETTER: To be responsible for the production of GSGRA-GSDC input into the GSGRA Newsletter. To act as a liaison between the chapter and state newsletter.
- OFFICE MANAGER: To be responsible for the running of the chapter office. These duties include, but are not limited to: obtaining office supplies, beverages, and the cleanliness of the office.
- DONATIONS: To oversee the selection of beneficiaries of GSGRA-GSDC donations. To present the selection(s) to the chapter membership for their approval.
- PRIDE: To be a liaison between GSGRA-GSDC and SDG & L PRIDE. To coordinate the chapter's activities during San Diego Pride weekend.

CHAPTER SPONSORSHIP: To solicit sponsors for GSGRA-GSDC.
