

We will do so at no charge, subject to space availability and wherever possible we will assist with typesetting and layout. Electronically submitted articles and camera ready ad layouts that conform to our mechanics will be given preference.

ARTICLES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS An article or announcement is a text only submission that we can incorporate with other articles in *The Chute*. We will typeset these articles and choose fonts and styles of presentation to fit with the overall look of our publication. The following options are available to you. We heavily favor the first option.

Submit your article:

1. as text within an e-mail (not a file attached to an e-mail).

- as a text file produced in MS Word 6.0 or 7.0 format, attached to an e-mail or on a disc by regular mail. Please do not format in titles, headers, graphics etc. as we have to strip these and reformat your item to fit in with other articles in *The Chute*. We request that you submit text only.
- 3. as typed hard copy by regular mail.

ADVERTISMENTS An advertisement is usually fully formatted and camera ready and may include graphics, pictures etc. We will accept ads that conform to the following mechanics. Non conforming submissions may be modified. If you are not familiar with this process, simply fit your ad inside a rectangle in one of the sizes shown below. You may submit your ad in hard copy or fully formatted to our mechanics by e-ail using MS Publisher 2.0 or Word 6.0 or 7.0.

Our actual page size is 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide by 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches high. A $\frac{1}{4}$ inch clear border is required, no bleeds therefore the actual mechanics are:


