



Members who work the chutes, being a judge, a chapter or state officer, committee chair, or being a ready and willing volunteer that made it all happen. THANK YOU! Thanks to Sherry Le, GLAC, we have "Team GSGRA" shirts. It is this type of enthusiasm based on the experience you members have, which will continue our momentum into 2001

I have talked with many of you and the challenges we have ahead are not new, but due for a fresh look. Now it is time to look to future:

Membership:


