What's up with Sacramento?

Many people are confused what's going on with the former Capital Crossroads chapter. Here are some answers to common questions:

Q. What happened to the Capital Crossroads chapter?

A. GSGRA and the Capital Crossroads group severed their ties in March. The

Capital Crossroads group voted to proceed independent of GSGRA and is now doing business under its corporate name, the Capital Crossroads Gay Rodeo Association (CCGRA).

Q. I was a Capital Crossroads chapter member, but now there's no chapter.

Am I still a GSGRA member?

A. YES! When the Capital Crossroads group ceased to be a chapter of GSGRA, all of its members automatically became GSGRA "members at large" -- members of GSGRA but not affiliated with any chapter. (Technically, none of us is a member of any chapter: We're all members of GSGRA, and merely affiliated with a specific chapter if we wish.)

Q. How can I become part of another GSGRA chapter?

A. To switch chapters or to change from "member at large," put it in writing, sign it, and get it to the GSGRA state membership chair or to the membership chair of the chapter you want to join. You can use the form below if you like.

Q. Is the Capital Crossroads Gay Rodeo Association (CCGRA) a part of the International Gay Rodeo Association?

A. No, it has no ties to either IGRA or GSGRA.

Q. How does this affect rodeos?

A. To compete in any IGRA-sanctioned rodeo (like San Jose, San Diego, L.A.

or Phoenix), a contestant needs to be a member of one of the IGRA Associations, such as GSGRA. Membership in CCGRA is not adequate compete in an IGRA-sanctioned rodeo.

Q. What's up with the Sacramento rodeo in August?

A. We understand CCGRA is proceeding with the Sierra Stampede, but the event will not be an IGRA-sanctioned rodeo because CCGRA is not part of IGRA or GSGRA. The organizers of the event will not be bound by any of IGRA's rules and regulations, and contestants will not earn points toward the IGRA Finals Rodeo.

Q. I was a Capital Crossroads chapter member. Am I now a member of the Capital Crossroads Gay Rodeo Association?

A. You'll have to check with them. We heard that that all GSGRA members who had been affiliated with the Capital Crossroads Chapter were automatically made members of CCGRA but do not know for sure.

Q. Could CCGRA eventually become a part of IGRA?

A. That's their intent, but it seems impossible under IGRA rules.





Educational Findings

Let's Go For A Walk!

Please ALWAYS lead your horse properly at your right-hand side. So many experienced horsepeople walk along casually holding the end of the rope, letting the horse lag behind them or wander along. Many accidents happen this way when a horse in such a situation is startled and jumps into the human. It is also very inconsiderate around others, because the horse can easily bother other horses when the handler isn't paying attention. It doesn't matter who you are; you are setting an example for others by your good or bad habits.

How Many Fingers Am I Holding Up?

The hand feeding of horses is a popular past time of amateurs, but something you'll rarely see done by professionals. Horses are mouthy by nature, since their sense of touch; smell and taste all help them to categorize objects, making them constantly wanting to place their mouth on things. Hand feeding treats teaches horses to put their mouth on you and leads to a lack of respect from the horse. A submissive horse in the herd would never consider placing his mouth on the dominant herd leader. Horses are prone to nip and bite already, by hand feeding them treats, we only encourage this behavior. More than one individual has lost a finger this way. Your horses will be just as happy to eat his treats from a bucket; he will enjoy them just as much and it will not lead to rude and dangerous behavior.

How's It Hangin'?

Western saddles are great for many things and one of the things we love the most about them is the horn. It is so handy for hanging your bridle on or hanging on to when your horse goes south on you. And isn't it handy to hook the stirrup over the horn while you fiddle with the cinch? But PLEASE don't leave the stirrup hooked on the horn while the saddle is sitting on the saddle rack. As saddles break in, the stirrups leathers twist and bend to the shape of the rider's leg, making it easier to keep the foot in the stirrup and giving support to the rider's leg. When you leave the stirrup hooked on the horn while it is in the rack, the leather will twist the wrong way and the short flap that covers the stirrup will curl up and be uncomfortable. Make sure when saddles of any kind are placed on the rack that all the leather is straight and hanging down [but not on the floor - a subject for the next Chute issue.






