## IGRA University 2003,2004

A reminder that 19th Annual IGRA Conventions 2003 will be in Phoenix, AZ July31-August 3, 2003. Hosted by AGRA. The 16th Annual IGRA Finals Rodeo 2003 will be in Tulsa, OK October 24-26, 2003 Hosted by OGRA with support from SSRA. Bids were awarded to CGRA for Convention 2004 and HGRA for Finales 2004. There was discussion about moving Convention out of the summer and in to February to fee up the summer weekends for Rodeos. Amy Griffin as the Rodeo Growth and Development chair and her committee are looking into the feasibility of this move. University 2003 will be held at the Busch Learning Center in St Louis, Mo February 14-16, 2003.

#### **Rodeo Rules Changes**

There are some 22 pages of Rodeo Rules Changes. Some of the changes are editorial others are deletion of duplications and some rules were just move to a more appropriate location in the book. Now have said that us get on with a few of the big ones. All the new Rules will take effect November 1, 2002.



Contestant entry fees were raised to \$23. (First increase, by the way, since 1994.) The additional \$3 will go to the Hosting Association to help with the Rodeo production cost. In addition, it was agreed that the horse stalls should be included as part of this rodeo production cost. Horse contestants will not be the only ones that are assisting with the rodeo production cost, (paying stall fees whether the Hosting Association occurs cost for them or not.) All contestants will now help with the rodeo production with \$4 now going to the Hosting Association. This is in line with associations such as PRCA where Permit Card holders are required to pay a \$10 stock fee per event that they enter. Contestants with a horse will now get one free stall for the rodeo weekend. Contestants requiring additional stalls for Please note that the rule changes listed above horses may be required to pay a stall fee not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per horse stall for the rodeo weekend. Tack stall price are set by the hosting association and not part of this rule.

Variances to an IGRA rodeo requirement or rule must be approved by the IGRA Board of Trustees on later than 45 day prior to the rodeo.

Stock contractor must carry his/her own liability insurance. The policy information will be recorded on the Trustee's Rodeo Checklist. The Hosting Rodeo Association shall also obtain a copy of this liability insurance policy.

#### **Rodeo Protest Procedures**

When a protest is being reviewed, the announcer will be advised and will make an announcement that the event is under protest. The Secretary will be advised and will post a notice on the posting board that the event is "Under Protest".

Gender: For the purposes of competition within I.G.R.A., any transgender contestant is eligible to register and compete under the gender classification with which the individual identifies and lives as on a daily basis. Transgender contestants must present to an IGRA Auditor evidence of changing from their gender at birth. This documentation will be kept on file at the IGRA Administrative Office and only needs to be evaluated one time. Evidence may be their legal driver's license or I.D. card

if it indicates gender. The driver's license or

I.D. card will be photocopied by the IGRA Auditor for the file. If the transgender contestant is in the process of changing their gender. they must provide the IGRA Auditor adequate documentation, such as recommended by the "Harry Benjamin International Gender Dysphoria Association" showing they are in the process.

#### Mandatory new contestants meeting

A mandatory meeting and roll call for new contestants will be held before the start of the rodeo. All new contestants will be notified of the meeting and the requirement of disqualification for failure to attend.

I attended the IGRA Convention in Cleveland as a delegate for GSGRA at the end of July. It was the 5th convention I had attended and the smoothest.

The first session I attended was the Corporate Sponsorship Committee. We discussed various techniques of getting the most of our sponsor relationships. Keeping the relationship active all year around was the theme. Work with your Bud Light Distributor often and send announcements to keep them up-to-date and aware what you are doing for them all year around.

I chaired the PR/Marketing Committee meeting. The main points we discussed were identifying the 5 P's of Marketing as

they pertain to Rodeos/Associations/ Chapters. Product, Price, Place, Promotion and Packaging. I again stressed the importance of knowing our Product ... what are we selling? Western Heritage? Dancing? Socialization? Romance? Do we sell our rodeo differently from the way we sell the year round experience of the Chapter/Association. We did this for all of the P's and shared techniques used around the country.

I then attended the IGRA University Committee meeting. During the meeting we discussed last year's experience and plans for this year. The first University was held in Reno, then Omaha and has now found a permanent home at the Budweiser Learning Facility in St. Louis. It will be held again this year on President's weekend. There will be a Royalty Track and a Rodeo Director track. I would encourage folks to attend University if they are looking for some serious training on Rodeo Production or Royalty competition

The action on convention floor was pretty tame this year. The new changes to horse stall fees was a great example of how we listened with an open mind to what seemed at first to me, a crazy idea! Phil had attended the committee meetings and shared with the delegation the logic behind the change and it changed my mind. In the end our delegation supported the change.



## Message from the President ...




