

SD RODEO DOCUMENTARY

A video team from Fort Lauderdale, Florida, is producing a documentary video on the history of gay rodeo and the IGRA. The team recently completed filming events and some background of the IGRA in Denver during the Colorado Gay Rodeo.

Bill Ward is the producer and financier of the not-for-profit production. Where

this product differs from many gay rodeo television productions of the past is that all of the original footage, transcripts, and of course, the final product will be donated to the IGRA and the

Stonewall Library of Fort Lauderdale. These important documents of gay history will be available for current and future historians of gay rodeo and history.

The IGRA Documentary portion will record the history



of the gay rodeo. The essence of this film is to capture the "story" of the gay rodeos from founding to present. On camera and oral interviews will include the founders, current and former competitors, sponsors and supporters. Their stories of logistical hurdles, emotional reactions, trials and successes will be recorded for current and future historians. The film will allow others to witness the courage and commitment made by the men and women of the gay rodeo circuit, and appreciate the millions of dollars contributed made to the gay and straight communities through their efforts.

The Rodeo Documentary will show that the rodeo is FUN! Though many thousands of gay men and women know that, many more millions do not. Camp events make everyone laugh. At the rodeo, food, beer, country/western dancing, and plenty of vendors create a truly carnival atmosphere. Evening activities include competitions in country/western dance, special performance teams, and a friendly and enjoyable environment for thousands of fans. The viewer will be treated to all aspects and uniqueness of the gay rodeos. Selected riders from each event will be interviewed and later filmed as they compete in their events. The spirit of these competitors and their own personal stories will be woven into the final product.

Another Perspective

The 2003 IGRA Convention in Phoenix, Arizona, was my first time attending an IGRA Convention. It was quite an honor to be serving as a delegate to the convention on behalf of GSGRA.

My overall impression of the event are WOW! I was impressed at

the professionalism, the courtesy and the team work taken to make this a successful event.

I was a member of the Bylaws committee and we spent a better portion of the first day of convention reviewing proposed bylaws changes. Although there was nothing earth shattering, it was a learning experience. The majority of items to be changed in the bylaws revolved around stripping out specific date references and changing them to time frames. This was all being done in anticipation of a change of the operating year of IGRA. The bylaws committee reviewed all proposed bylaws (approximately 30 proposals) and approved about 1/3 of them. The one proposal on building a hall of fame was approved as an idea, but thrown to committee to be developed and to have the rules built out with a bit more thought and with some strong feedback from the bylaws committee. The calendar year changes were approved which opened up the rodeo year calendar for more summer events. while moving convention to the end of the year for 2004.

Throughout the convention I was impressed at the communications, the sharing of informa-

on and the overall plans IGRA has. We are, an organization, clearly going to need to cus on growth. Statistics showing that we e declining, aging, and getting hurt more. I ersonally feel that the age statistic could also e seen as a positive, in that there is a potenal for more disposable income. Additionally, GRA member associations need to get on top f sponsorship and compliance. All organizaons are not doing the outstanding job reuired if we want to retain our corporate level ponsors.

inally, two new associations were inducted to IGRA (Smokey Mountain and Red liver). A discussion was had about making ure that all member associations have the vords "Gav Rodeo Association: which was lefeated - despite talks about how hat appears to be sending us ack to the closet.

GSGRA is obviously a healthy organization in he IGRA - however we nave some room to grow as well. First and oremost, GSGRA needs to refresh the image t presents. Looking around the convention we have done a great job of marketing our rodeos especially the Best Buck in the Bay) as it was pard to not see at least a half dozen people wearing GSGRA rodeo shirts at any given ime. However, from a more corporate level presence, we have one of the oldest looking badges in the crowd and can use a refresh on that level, similar to what we did with the Team shirts.

I want to thank the membership of GSGRA for allowing me to represent the organization at convention, and look forward to having that opportunity again for 2004 in Denver and Jim Hauck 2005 in Calgary.
