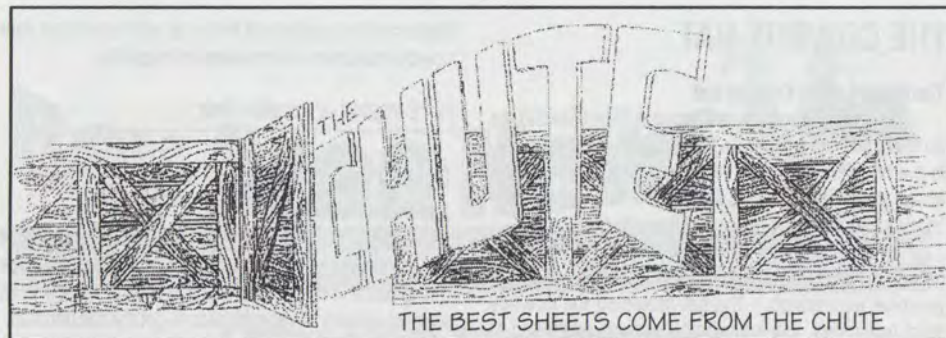

THE COWBOY HAT

The History of the Cowboy Hat

Originally, a cowboy was covered from head to toe for work and every item he wore had a useful purpose. In our next few education sections, we are going to talk about these items, how they came about and how today's cowboy can take care of these items.

One of the items that every cowboy wore was a hat and this hat was cowboy's proudest and most personal possession. The hat protected the cowboy from hailstones, low-lying branches and was used to fan a fire or to carry water. A cowboy so hated to be without his hat that the western etiquette allowed him to wear it even when he sat down to a meal indoors, or while he was hoping around the dance floor with a cattle-town belle. They say that a cowboy sometimes wore his hat to bed. Cowboy head gear was made differently, because of functional features. A sugar-loaf sombrero had a broad brim and high peak that offered good protection from the desert sun. The low-crowned plains man hat served well in windy regions. As important as functional features were such fine points of style as the Montana Peaks four-sided crown or the star on a Texas Hat.

Wearing of Today's Cowboy Hat

Wear your western hat sort of level on your head and about half inch above your ears where it feels best. It should fit slightly snug all around your head but not so that it hurts or "gives you a headache". If the hat is a little to loose, place insulation tape around the inside of the brim to take in a little of the slack. The top of your head should touch the inside top of the hat. This helps insure the hat does not blow off in heavy wind. However, in extremely windy conditions, it is often worth while to pull the hat down lower across your forehead to prevent the hat flying off down the road.

When putting your hat on or taking it off you should note that any handling will cause flexing or bending of the brim and crown, which will gradually weaken the hat; the more severe the bending or flexing, the sooner your hat will loose its ability to retain its natural shape.

While putting on or taking off your felt hat, always handle the hat by the front and back of the brim just next to the crown with four fingers. This will help keep the crown clean and the shape neat and crisp. Do this whenever possible with washed hands, especially with the lighter colors such as Silver Belly or Silver Sand. It is normal for a hat to fade with time & to loose some fur.

Next month education will follow up with how to put your cowboy hat down and cowboy hat etiquette.

So join us on the 16th at King's starting at 8PM, and then finish off the evening at Oil Can Harry's!

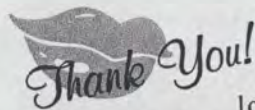

So please try to make time on at least one weekend this month to come to a bar event, or to hang up posters in your area. We'll post posters and other promo materials at the July 17th chapter meeting.

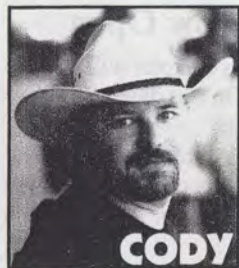
