

YOSIMTE TRIP 2006 FOR LA RODEO PROPLE

We are planning this for the fall of 2006! FOR NOW this is for members of The Greater Los Angeles Rodeo Association ONLY- we expect interest to be high. It will be AFTER THE LABOR DAY HOLIDAY (2006), DONE MID-WEEK, and "off season" to save money and miss the peak season. Our "target dates" are near the end of the September 2006. Space is limited! This is a (horse) CAMPING trip! We will be EXPECTING all to RSVP by spring of 2006 (March-April). Any (Rodeo/CMSA) schedule conflicts will be resolved in favor of this trip-due to the travel logistics, park reservations, and the people who will need to plan for 1 week away from work.

While this is being done for members of GSGRA with

horses-OTHERS (MEMBERS FROM L.A.) ARE WELCOME! Hikers, bikers, and just people who want to enjoy the park are welcome. Car pooling and doubling up will be encouraged- people MUST be able to GET ALONG with others!! Each camper will be responsible for their needs, bringing the correct camping equipment and food. Each horse owner will be responsible for making sure their horse has the proper shoes, tack, vet checks (required by the park), as well as their own camping needs. Some extra space MAY BE available for those who have horses but no trailers. For example we have a 3 horse trailer and double cab truck-we can take one horse, and two passengers-you will need a tent and food. We will try and publish a "wish list" with contact names for people who want to double up! Each month we will send you an e mail for you to print out and use for your planning.

The exact cost has yet to be determined. We know what the fee to enter the park is, we know what the cost of horse boarding is (13.00 per day they feed, water, and muck stalls). Camping space fees, the cost of "wilderness permits" are expected to go up in 2006, so we are waiting. Also, FUEL is a concern-most have big trucks and big horse trailers and it is 350 miles from Los Angeles (one way) so start thinking about these items. Plus, you will need "bear safe" food containers for just about anything with a "smell" or odor (shampoos, ECT...)-this is required by the park. Some of these fees can be split by several people traveling together as a group. Camp sites are limited to 6 people per site, and vehicles are limited to 40 ft in length.

As it stands now, once we have an established (a base) list of 18 people we will publish the list and make "a group reservation"-this group will be done "first come first serve!" We can apply for a group camp ground, and wilderness permits once the snow melts and the park opens in either March, April, May-depending on weather. We are limited to 15 horses and 15 riders in the park. Once we have the reservation you will get a notice from us as to the date of departure and expected date of return to the LA area. The first 'cost" for us is the camp grounds. If you can not go then the next person on the wish list will replace you- if the next person it is a couple we will (try) NOT split up domestic partners. We will try and be flexible and count both as 1 person (even though you are really two). This is how we want to make our reservations-unless you make reservations independently and travel with us-which is welcomed.

Bikers and hikers will be responsible for what ever they intend to use-it is up to you! Free shuttle service is provided by the park as are some maps of the various hiking trails are on line. You should be in reasonably good health and take what ever medication you will need for 1 week.

Horse owners MUST make sure your animals are "healthy", in shape, have a negative coggins test, are up to date on their shots (with supporting documentation), horses must have steel shoes, and horses must be well broke for trails. NO STUDS PERMITTED BY THE PARK SERVICE-ONLY MARES AND GELDINGS!
