

#### And now some News from the Bylaws Committee...

Voting on Bylaws Proposals to Take Place at May Chapter Meeting There will be two Bylaws proposals presented for your consideration at the May Chapter Meeting. Voting on these proposals will also take place at this same meeting. Copies of the two proposals will be posted to the Yahoo Group at least 30 days before the May meeting.

The first proposal would move the Annual Meeting of Members to September and move the Elections for the Board of Directors to the July Chapter Meeting. The newly elected directors would be seated immediately following the Annual Meeting of Members. The intention is to give the newly elected directors some time to learn what is expected of them, plan for their administration, and be involved in the creation of the following year's rodeo budget.

The second proposal is a competing proposal. It would move the Annual Meeting of Members to November and move the Elections for the Board of Directors to the July Chapter Meeting. The newly elected directors would be seated immediately following the September Chapter Meeting. The intention here is the same as the first, but in addition it allows the newly elected directors to plan for and run the Annual Meeting of Members.

#### Christy Cotton: The Saltwater Cowgirl

Breakaway roping is unique among rodeo events, offering the challenge of a horse, a human, a lasso, and a calf all in motion at one time. And, if executed well, it is an event that is over a few short moments after it begins. It is this brief interplay between cowgirl, critters and rope that is a favorite of Christy Cotton's, who one might easily assume was born into the world of competitive rodeo.

"Once I nod my head, my arm had better be swingin' that rope and my horse had better be coming out, because that calf is going as soon as the chute opens," Christy explains. "I need to be throwing my rope within two swings of when I come out...swing, swing, BOOM. It's all a matter of seconds."

A fixture on the gay rodeo circuit for over a decade, Christy has amassed a bewildering array of ribbons, event-championships belt buckles, and All-Around Cowgirl titles. But it wasn't until 1991, at the age of 33, that she attended her first rodeo – gay or otherwise – and, in an instant, she was fit to be tied. She had a new calling, and vowed to be a part of it in any way she could.

#### Horsh-U By Mike Warren

#### Standardbred

Breed Description:

The Standardbred is perhaps best known in the sport of harness racing. In harness racing, Standardbred racing is contested on two gaits, the trot and the pace. Trotters move with a diagonal gait; the left front and right rear legs move in unison, as do the right front and left rear. It requires much skill by the trainer to get a trotter to move perfectly at high speeds, even though the trotting gait is a natural one in the animal world.

Pacers, on the other hand, move the legs on one side of their body in tandem: left front and rear, and right front and rear. This action shows why pacers are often called "side-wheelers." Pacers, which account for about 80 percent of the performers in harness racing and are the faster of the two gaits, are aided in maintaining their gait by plastic loops called hobbles, which keep their legs moving in synchronization. Pacing is a natural gait.

Average Height: 15 hands

Colors: Bay, black, brown, chestnut, gray, roan

Conformation:

In many respects, the Standardbred resembles the Thoroughbred. However, it is often more muscled and longer in body, and does not stand as tall, averaging between 15 and 16 hands. The head is bigger and may sport a Roman nose.

Standardbreds tend to have a higher neck set that other light horse breeds, somewhat similar to the Morgan.

Temperament:

Standardbreds are intelligent, willing, and have an excellent work ethic. They are laid back and calm in nature, though they do enjoy competing.

Members of this breed often excel in the following disciplines:

- Harness racing
- Versatility

Huntseat or dressage

Breed History:

The origins of the Standardbred trace back to Messenger, an English Thoroughbred foaled in 1780, and later exported to the United States. Messenger was the great-grandsire of Hambletonian 10, to whom every Standardbred can trace its heritage. Standardbreds are a relatively new breed, dating back just over 200 years, but it is a true American breed. The name "Standardbred" originated because the early trotters (pacers would not come into

the early trotters (pacers would not come into the picture until much later) were required to reach a certain standard for the mile distance in order to be registered as part of the new breed. The mile is still the standard distance covered in nearly every harness race.

Standardbred racing has long been known as the sport of the people, and both the sport and the breed are as much a part of our American landscape as cowboys and apple pie. As it evolved it gave the United States some of its first "sports heroes," including the great Dan Patch, the legendary Adios and the great gray ghost, Greyhound.


