

#### **David Watkins Memorial Fund**

We congratulate all of our G.S.G.R.A. members that qualified and will be invited to the I.G.R.A. Finals Rodeo in Reno, Nevada this year. At the Annual Convention of Members in May 1999, the purpose and method of disbursement of the David Watkins Memorial Fund were amended to reflect the changing nature of our organization. Please review the following information and take note of the modifications to the fund.

The original purpose of the David Watkins Memorial Fund was to offer some limited support to contestants to help defray the expenses involved in competing in the I.G.R.A. Finals Rodeo. It is recognized that contestants in horse

> events incur expenses over and above those incurred by contestants

in general with the result that G.S.G.R. A. was often under represented in these events. With this in mind, the fund was to focus on, but not be limited to this particular problem.

G.S.G.R.A

The fund consists of such moneys as may be donated to the fund from time to time. G.S.G.R.A. will hold such funds to be distributed by way of grants, solely to assist in defraying expenses incurred by contestants competing in the I.G.R.A. Finals Rodeo. Members of our G.S.G.R.A. Royalty are the primary contributors to this fund and we greatly appreciate their time and dedication to this endeavor.

In order to qualify to receive a grant from the fund, contestant must:

 Have been a member of G.S.G.R.A., in good standing, from the date of the first rodeo in the current season (beginning January 2006) in which the contestant competed through the weekend of the Finals Rodeo.

- Have earned all points for the current I.G.R.A. Finals Rodeo as a declared member of G.S.G.R.A.
- Compete in the Finals Rodeo.

Funds may be distributed by way of grants in two categories, general expenses and horse related expenses.

- a) In the general category, contestants may request grants towards the following expenses:
  - Hotel accommodation not to exceed the hotel basic rate for Friday through Sunday night, and only the actual share of room cost incurred.
  - Travel from the home city to the Finals City and return; air fare not to exceed the least expensive advance reservation rate or fuel only if driving.
  - iii) Registration fees only for the events in which the contestant was qualified and invited.
- b) In addition to the above, the Horse contestants may request grants towards the following expenses:
  - i) Trailer and/or truck rental and fuel costs.
  - Lodging expenses in transit and horse boarding expenses (stable/pasture)

Qualified contestants may submit

grant requests for approved expenses. Grant request must:

- Be received no later than 45 days after the Finals Rodeo.
- 2. Detail the expenses incurred.
- Attach receipts for all expenses to be considered.

Grants will be made proportionally. The amount available for grants in a category will be divided by the total of the qualified requests in that category. The result will be calculated to a percentage and applied to the amount requested.

To apply for a grant, please send a detailed accounting of all expenses incurred, receipts (or copies) for all expenses, and proof of participation in the Finals. You may use the "GSGRA Check Request" found at the GSGRA. ORG website. This documentation shall be **received** no later than 27 December 2006 (this is holiday season so allow extra time for mail delivery), to:




# Buckskin

### The family of Duns

Contrary to the belief of many, the Buckskin or Dun horses are not a mere "color" in the equine world. Those who studied genetics some time ago believed that the Dun horse was the result of a dilution gene, and that breeding Duns and Buckskins to each other often resulted in the birth of an Albino foal. More recent studies have proven this to be in error. The true Buckskin horse may trace his lineage through a direct line of Dun or Buckskin colored ancestors, as far back as recorded history of the animal are available.



The Buckskin is thought to of originated from the Spanish Sorraia. The Norwegian Dun, found today in Norway and other Scandinavian countries is a breed so old that his actual origin is lost in antiquity. However, there are many indications that even he obtained his Dun Coloring from the horses of Spain. The blood of the Sorraia (and the Norwegian Dun as well) filtered into nearly every breed found in the world today, hence the fact that the Buckskin, Dun or Grulla may be found in nearly every breed.



No-the Buckskin horse in not a mere "color." Buckskins, Grulla and Duns are noted for many qualities that are not characteristic of other types of horses. Their color is an indication of the superior genetic heritage they possess. Buckskins have been long noted for their superior qualities and strength. They have more stamina, more determination, harder feet, better bone, and are generally hardier than other horses. A Buckskin with weak or spavined legs is a rarity.
