Proud Horizons, Gay Lesbian Straight Education Network-Omaha (GLSEN-Omaha) and the metropolitan Omaha Gay Straight Alliances eagerly announce the Tom Mahony Pride Prom 2006 for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) youth and their straight allies aged 14-23 will be held Saturday, May 20 from 7-11 PM at Cary Hall in First United Methodist Church, 7020 Cass, Omaha, NE. The dance, very similar to last year's, which 111 youth attended, will have a DJ, photographer, uniformed security officers and plenty of refreshments. The theme selected for this year's dance is Masquerade. Admission is \$5.00 per person, payable at the door.

Beginning this year we are dedicating our annual prom to Tom Mahony. In the mid 1990's the Omaha School Board was reviewing the student code of conduct. Tom Mahony and his wife stood with their gay son as he spoke to the school board regarding harassment he received in a gym class. Following this presentation the school board, in a nearly unanimous vote, added sexual orientation to the district's student harassment policy. Tom Mahony passed away last year. In recognition of this family's courage, the prom organizers chose to honor Tom. Dave England from Proud Horizons said, "In supporting their son, Tom and his wife were saying their son deserved the same protection from harassment as other students. It is always important for us to remember our heritage. Today's students need to know that the protection afforded them resulted from the Mahony family's action."

Proud Horizons is a youth support group for LGBT youth and their allies. Sponsored by Parents Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays, Omaha Chapter, Proud Horizons provides a safe space for youth to discuss life's issues with their peers and to create a social network.

### RODEO EVENTS

This month we are featuring 3 more events that you will see at the Heartland Rodeo. Unlike the previous events that we've covered, these will require a horse. These are known as the speed events: barrels, flags, and poles. These 3 events pit horse and rider against the clock. Negotiating the prescribed pattern is a test of the rider's skill and the horse's agility. Some of these events look easy, but try them at 30 miles per hour. Cowboy hat, boots, long sleeve shirt and jeans are required for all these events. Have fun and I hope to see you on the rodeo circuit.

### Barrel Racing ~ Speed Event

Contestants vie for the fastest time in running a triangular, cloverleaf pattern around 3 barrels. The horse and rider are allowed a running start; time begins and ends as they cross a visible starting line. Knocking over a barrel results in a five second penalty. If the contestant goes off the prescribed course, they are disqualified. Fastest time wins.

### Pole Bending ~ Speed Event

In this event, horse and rider compete for the fastest time, weaving a linear pattern through six equally spaced poles placed 21 feet apart. This event is more challenging for the horse, which is required to change leads as it weaves through the poles. As in barrel racing, a 5 second penalty is assessed for knocking down a pole, and a disqualification results from breaking the pattern. A winning time in pole bending is usually between 21.0-23.0 seconds.

### Flag Racing ~ Speed Event

Flag racing is set on a simple, triangular course anchored by two barrels and a pole. Atop each barrel is a bucket filled with pellets and one of them displaying a flag. The rider must bring the horse as close to the barrel as possible, pick up the flag from the first bucket, race around the end pole to the second barrel and attempt to stick the flag in the second bucket. Penalty point are assessed if the bucket, barrel, or end pole are knocked over. A rider is disqualified if the second bucket or barrel is knocked over. It may look easy, but speeds in this event can reach 30 miles per hour!

Rich P. 3rd in 3rd go of calf roping, 4th overall in steer deco, 4th in 1st go of goat dressing.


