IGRA University has come and gone and all I can say is that we blew the lid off. All kinds of records were

set and the feedback we received has been fantastic. We ended up with 99 registered students plus about 24 staff for the event.

On Thursday, I attended the 2008 IGRA Finals committee meeting where we made sever-

al important decisions regarding Finals. As I have reported before, IGRA has taken ownership of Finals Rodeo and will now be responsible for all the costs and revenues related to the event. The associations will be more directly involved in running the event as well. We spent time on the organizational chart and determined what areas we would ask associations to cover. NGRA will design and coordinate national marketing and media for the event and we will provide coordination of event ticketing; both advance and on-site. Other associations have accepted responsibility for other areas such as stock, barn security, grand entry, buckles and ribbons, rodeo program, etc. We also determined the prices for various sponsorship opportunities available to associations and individuals. I will give a full report on these at the Board and Membership meetings and make a recommendation.

The Thursday night event at Badlands was a blast and we raised a lot of money (see fundraising report). Melissa and Jackson did a great job of putting that project together.

Friday I attended the IGRA Executive Board meeting, General Board meeting and Trustee meeting. To summarize, IGRA approved several new policies regarding Fundraising, IGRA merchandise, rodeo liability insurance and approved a new "Member Support Fund" to aid member contestants, volunteers and rodeo staff who are injured at a rodeo.

The Royalty Competition on Friday was unbelievable. Charlie's was packed and the energy was electric. The competition went off without a hitch and featured some of the best performances I have ever seen at one of our competitions. Scheduling our Royalty Competition to coincide with IGRA-U was a hugely successful idea (though slightly exhausting). Congratulations to the new Royalty team and to Mitch Gill for a night we won't soon forget. Also I'd like to offer special thanks to Tom Coleman for all his many contributions to the cause over this last year.






