The World Gay Rodeo Finals meeting was very productive. We approved the stock contract, the rodeo program contract, the rodeo officials and the marketing plan. We reviewed the budget and the schedule of events and discussed entertainment options. The event is shaping up very nicely and I'm excited to be able to participate as Rodeo Director.

NGRA has also formed the NGRA Finals Planning Committee that will meet immediately following our membership meeting each month. Please come get involved and help NGRA host the best Finals ever.

The first rodeo of the year, Road Runner Regional Rodeo on Phoenix is in a couple of weeks. Rumor has it that Kathy Griffin will be there filming for her show, *My Life on the D List* on Bravo. Sounds like a fun way to start the rodeo season!

Welcome readers! This is a new, and will be an ongoing, column for the NGRA BigHorn Gazette called, "Straight from the Horse's..." (mouth). This will be an interview with Cowboys & Cowgirls from across the IGRA Competitive Circuit. We will highlight certain events in rodeo monthly and talk to the riders and their animal counterparts for an in-depth exposé into the world of competing in an IGRA Sanctioned Rodeo. For the launch issue, we will interview NGRA's very own Chris Due and his trusted Equine Partner, Nickel.

Joel: Hello Mr. Due. Thank you for taking time out of your day to meet with our readers, and being our first featured Cowboy! How long have you been involved in NGRA/IGRA?

Chris: I competed in my first IGRA rodeo in 2004 in LA on a horse named Rocky that would soon become my first rodeo horse. I still love that little horse and he's still competing on the IGRA circuit with Diane Fleming. Nickel: You still love Rocky? Is there something I should know, Chris?

J: Alrighty then. Umm... Moving on. What is your horse's name and tell us about him?

C: I have three that I use for rodeo. Nickel Dream (Nic) 13 years old, 17 hands, appendix quarter horse; Diamond On Command (Big D) 13 years old, 15.2 hands, solid color paint; and old reliable Deb's Little Rocket (Rocky) 17 years old, 15 hands, quarter horse.

N: As you can see, I am the Big Boy in that bunch. Take that, Rocky!



J: (Laughs) How long have you been together?

C: Nic is my main mount and I've been competing with him since 2007. N: Time sure flies when you're having fun! And in speed events, it flies even faster.

J: What events do you compete in, Chris?

C: Barrel Racing, Pole Bending, Flag Race, Calf Roping on Foot, Breakaway Roping and Steer Deco.

J: What are you current rankings?

C: Currently I am not ranked. The first Rodeo of the season is in

Phoenix next month.

N: I hope he is aware that it is taking place over Valentine's Day. (Hint, Hint)

J: Have you ever buckled in any of these?

C: Yes, Steer Deco a couple of times.

N: I didn't get any shiny buckle, but my our Union has begun working on this for me. I like to get blinged out too., Chris. Like only the gays know how to do right!



J: Wow, Nic has guite the sense of humor. What's his temperament really like when he's not in the spotlight?

C: He's a true gentle giant. He's very laid back and easy going. He's eager to please and loves his job. He can sometimes get a little hot, but that's very rare for him.

N: Chris likes to believe he's the reason I get all hot. Sometimes I do it to give him a cheap thrill and it gets me my favorite horse cookies.

J: Let's focus on Barrel Racing for the remainder of the interview... What is your best time together?

C: Nic has run some pretty good times in IGRA rodeos. I think the fastest time we've run together on a small course was a 15 second pattern and on a large course, well, he's clocked a few 17 second times.

N: I do what I can to make him look good and I love the cheers and applause from the spectators.

J: What got you interested in Barrels?

C: I spent a couple of years in the horse show world and still enjoy it, but barrels is fast and exciting! It's just you and the clock... no judge telling you it didn't look good. It doesn't have to be pretty, just fast.

N: Oh no he didn't! Did he just say I don't have to be pretty, just fat? What? Oh, just fast. Well, I am still pretty.

J: What is the most difficult element? Is it the speed, the turns, stopping?

C: I think the most difficult element is the timing. You have to ask for certain queues and just the right time. I love the speed and for a bighorse like Nic, he can turn like a little horse. Stopping isn't a problem... I sometimes think that's his favorite speed! (All laugh)

["From the Horse's..." continued]

J: Have you ever hit the barrel? Any remaining battle wounds or are they all psychological?

C: I've hit many barrels. When Nic and I first started out, I didn't trust he would turn with speed, so I would slow him down way too soon. That is something we are still working on our timing. We are getting better. I have many, many scars on my legs from those 55-gallon drums hitting my shins at 30 mph!

N: I am scar free. I don't want to dent my figure with those things. They hurt.

J: Have you ever been fined for a fallen barrel, a dropped F-Bomb, lost hat?

C: I've gotten 5 second penalties for a knocked over barrel. I try not to drop too many f-bombs... it's usually rider error, not the horse. I do wear a stampede string on my hat so that I don't loose it, but I might have once or twice. N: I couldn't agree more... it's rider error.

J: Why barrels? What's the draw?

C: The speed and adrenaline rush! Going as fast as you can, and your 1200lb horse turning and going the other direction. It's a total adrenaline rush. There has to be a real connection between rider and horse.

N: We don't get a vote. I would rather enter the Apple Bobbing Event myself.

J: Who is your favorite rider?

C: Charmayne James is my favorite professional barrel racer. In the IGRA world, I would have to say, Richard Armstrong, Rick Manucy and Deb Freeman. They all have an amazing sense of how well a horse is working underneath them. They are always helpful with my runs and helping me become a better barrel racer!

N: To quote my favorite TV Show Glee, "It pains me to say this. And it does..." (whinnies) my favorite rider is far and away Chris. He treats me with such respect, love, and admiration.

J: Any last parting words of wisdom for our readers, Chris?

C: Speed events in rodeo, when done properly, make the event look effortless. It takes a lot of skill and a true connection and trust between horse and rider to make it a good run. The rider has to trust the horse will perform and the horse has to trust that the rider will always take care of them in and outside of the rodeo arena.

J: Nickel, do you have any last words about Chris to share with our readers?

N: He would like me to say that he treats me amazing and does all that he can to make sure I'm running in rodeos and barrel races for many years to come. From the chiropractic visits to the best shoes from the farrier (they don't make Jimmy Choo's in my size yet), as well as the best food and supplements for me to perform at my best. Chris does make time for me to just be a horse and not always working, like long rides in the desert to just clear both of our minds and enjoy being together. Besides... he does have the horse cookies! C: (Laughs) He truly is an amazing horse with a huge heart!
