AGRA - Arizona Gay Rodeo Association's 25th Annual Road Runner Regional Rodeo marked the first rodeo of the 2010 IGRA Rodeo Calendar. **Following** each rodeo, we will try to provide you statistics on how our NGRA Cowboys & Cowgirls are doing as they compete throughout the circuit. Representing NGRA at RRRR, were Chris Due & Richard Armstrong in the Speed Events (Barrel Racing and Flag Racing). While neither cowboy placed in the Top 8 during Saturday's Go-Round, First Richard Armstrong did place 7th on Sunday's Second Go-Round (pictured below) in Men's Barrel Racing with a time of 17.787 seconds. Richard also placed on Sunday's Second Go-Round in Men's Flag Racing and placed 5th with a time of 9.36 seconds.

Miss NGRA 2010, Kimberli Foxx, also competed, but under North Star Gay Rodeo Association, in Goat Dressing and placed 6th on the Sunday's Second Go-Round with a time of 11.65 seconds.

The association with the highest number of Team Points was NMGRA (New Mexico Gay Rodeo Association) with an impressive 2,194 points! NGRA finished 13th out of 16, with Richard's 50 points earned.



Welcome readers! This is a new, and will be an ongoing, column for the NGRA BigHorn Gazette called, "Straight from the Horse's..." (mouth). This will be an interview with Cowboys & Cowgirls from across the IGRA Competitive Circuit. We will highlight certain events in rodeo monthly and talk to the riders and their animal counterparts for an in-depth exposé into the world of competing in an IGRA Sanctioned Rodeo. Please join me in welcoming Mr. ILGRA 2010, Robert Bowden.

<u>Joel</u>: Hello! Thank you for taking time out for our readers! How long have you been involved in ILGRA/IGRA?

Robert: I have been active in ILGRA a little over a year after relocating to Chicago, IL from Nashville, TN.

J: What is your horse's name and tell us about him/her? (name, age, height, breeding, etc.)

R: Cheatin' Danger. He is an 11 year old, 15.3 hands high, Tennessee Walking Horse.

<u>Cheatin' Danger</u>: I ain't cheatin' nothing. Danger is my middle name! I eat geldings for breakfast. Grr, grr, meow, meow.

J: How long have you been together?

R: 7 years.

C: And no 7-year itch. I make Robert use his Vagisil. No one wants saddle itch. Ever!

J: As I understand it, you plan on competing on the circuit in the very near future. What events do you hope to compete in?

R: I hope to compete in speed events and a few camp events. Specifically Pole Bending, Flag Race and Steer Decorating.

C: I just want to compete in anything that makes me look pretty, shows my good side, and makes me look pretty some more. (Cheatin' Danger whinnies something that sounds like Little Richard's infamous "Woooo!")

J: And when do you want to begin competing in IGRA Rodeos? R: I hope to debut at the Windy City Rodeo this summer in Chicago, IL.

C: Yeah, the wind really puts the giddy up in my tail!

J: Do you have any previous competition background?

R: I think most of my background has been centered around competition. I am a competitive horse trainer by profession. I have been training Tennessee Walking Horses and Spotted Saddle Horses for over 12 years.

C: When you look like me, every day is a Beauty Contest. Being pretty is not as easy as it looks, but I do what I can.

J: Tell us about your Equestrian Training and teaching you do. R: I train both horses and riders for events around the country. My specialty has been teaching youth and amateur riders in various disciplines from Saddleseat to Western, Versatility and Driving events. Prior to my move to Chicago, I trained out of Franklin, TN full time. Now I travel to where my clients are.

J: Have you ever buckled, or whatever is comparable, in any of these?

R: Yes, I have. I would say that the most comparable to buckling in an event within my industry would be divisional championships and floral horseshoes. And I have brought home many "sets of roses" through out each year.

C: Floral horseshoes are my Christian Louboutin slingbacks! J: What's his temperament like?

R: He's a HAM! Loves attention and loves to perform.

C: Like mother, like son. Wooooo! Shut up. Robert is unusually laid back for someone so particular about details.

J: Let's focus on Pole Bending for the remainder of the interview... What is your goal together?

R: My goal is to successfully teach him a new skill and become a strong contender in this new arena. (He's used to being a pretty boy so learning to weave poles will be easy, convincing him to run in red dirt and other turf not so much)

C: Used to being? Used to being! Excuse me but <u>I am</u> a pretty boy! I'll teach you a skill.

J: And what is your goal for the 2010 Rodeo Season?

R: Well since IGRA doesn't give out Roses.... WE WANT BUCKLES!! SHINEY PRETTY BUCKLES!!C: As long as it does not clash with my prettiness, I will wear it proudly! Woooo!

J: What got you interested in Poles? What is the most difficult element? Is it the speed, the turns, the stopping?

R: The stopping. I work constantly to finish a run still in the saddle without running over people, horses, or the fence.

C: And I don't want to ruin my pedicure. That can be challenging on dirt though.

J: Have you ever hit the Pole?

C: Of Course, either you knock them over at home or you knock them over in ring... I prefer fixing all that at home.

C: Excuse me? You hit the pole? I didn't see you getting bandaged up. But McSteamy the Vet was hot, so it was not all that bad!

J: Any remaining battle wounds, or are they all psychological? R: I think 90% of mine are psychological with plenty of "IF I ONLY HAD..."

C: I guess that leaves me 10% in battle wounds. To quote my favorite pop chanteuse, Britney Spears, "Oops! I did it again."

J: Ever get fined for a fallen pole, a dropped F-Bomb, lost hat? R: KNOCK ON WOOD...No, I haven't. I'm a detail-oriented person so lost hats are a no-no. I've been competing in equestrian events since I was 9 and the first thing my dad taught me was sportsmanship. You win some, you lose some, but we get out there every week for the love of the sport. After any event he reminded me, "If you don't want it quoted in the news, then don't say it." C: Why do you think I am always telling you, "Shut up"?

J: Why poles? What's the draw?

The DETAILS. It's more than just speed. It requires knowledge of the horse you are on and how they run. Finesse to traverse the poles and leave them all standing.

C: As long as it does not make my butt look big, it's all good.

J: Who is your favorite rider? (IGRA)

R: Christy Cotton

C: I am a fan of Clinton Anderson. Who wouldn't want to be between those Aussie legs!! Woooooo! Shut up.

J: Any last parting words of wisdom for our readers, Robert? R: We may not always win, but we get out there every week for the love of the sport, the charities we help, and the friends we've made. If you always remember that, you will never have a bad rodeo.

J: And what can our readers learn straight from the horse's mouth? C: Pretty might not equate fast, but it sure looks GOOD in the winner's circle!

J: Thank you both for your time. And best of luck at Windy City Rodeo!!
