

NGRA Featured Member Spotlight

Benjamin Avant, Member Since 1996

NGRA Member Spotlight: Every month we will begin featuring a long-standing member of NGRA and celebrate their contributions to NGRA. This month, may we present Mr. Benjamin Avant...

Benjamin first joined NGRA in June 1996, just after the first NGRA BigHorn Rodeo. I had the pleasure of meeting Benjamin for the first time during IGRA University this past January. I had often heard of this enigma known as Benjamin Avant. Benjamin is such an asset to NGRA. His IGRA University classes on Parliamentary Procedures are among the most sought after and quickly filled classes. His knowledge, his passion, and his ravishing (albeit "Closeted") beauty, NGRA is better for having had such a dynamic individual supporting this organization. I found him to be a lot more relaxed and easy-going than scary and intimidating. I guess a few margaritas will loosen a cowboy up!

Benjamin had been a regular at Backstreet - better known as Charlie's today. He knew a lot of the rodeo folks, but never

really knew much about the organization until that first rodeo weekend. After attending the rodeo and meeting IGRA members from around the country, he was "roped". He says, "I had enjoyed watching rodeo and loved country dancing for many years, but I was never really interested in being a competitor in rodeo events." Not until attending BigHorn Rodeo did he realize how many other ways there were to get involved. He continues, "When I saw the Misters from other IGRA associations, I thought, 'Now THAT'S something I could do!" He was so inspired that he spoke with NGRA's President Gary L'Abbe and asked if he was too new to the organization to run for

something I could do!" He was so inspired that he spoke with NGRA's President Gary L'Abbe and asked if he was too new to the organization to run for Royalty that Fall. Benjamin said, "I'll never forget his words of advice. 'Your commitment and enthusiasm are as important as experience in working for the organization, so if you're interested, I would recommend that you run this year." Wise words Mr. L'Abbe. Benjamin did in fact run for Mr. NGRA that year was and was sashed as Mr. NGRA 1st Runner-Up... and he hasn't looked back ever since!

In July 1996, a month after he joined NGRA, Benjamin attended his first IGRA convention in Omaha, Nebraska. He was one of a handful of delegates that included Johann Kristinsson, Gary L'Abbe, and Ken Carney. "I was as green as they come, but I dived right in, attending committee meetings and participating in debate on the convention floor. I remember being in awe of IGRA President Tom Vance, IGRA Parliamentarian Charley Lanier, and others in their positions on the dais, and thinking, 'Wow, I wonder if I could ever do something like that.' Little did I know..."

Benjamin came back from Convention fired up and ready to get to work for NGRA! As we mentioned before, in the Fall of 1996, he became Mr. NGRA 1st Runner Up. The following year he became Mr. NGRA for 1998. He adds, "I don't know what it is about Royalty, but that wasn't enough for some people. After a lot of cajoling, I was persuaded to run for Miss Closet Ball. Miss NGRA 1997 Anita Lei became my 'Drag Mama,' teaching me all I needed to know about how to place my feet, hold my hands and fingers, and walk like a lady. Well, I (aka Miss Victoria Blair) won the damn contest, so she must have taught me something!" While Benjamin doesn't think s/he was ever completely comfortable (or very good, honestly) as a lady, others in NGRA beg to differ. Benjamin tended to entertain and raise money more often as Mr. NGRA than as Miss Closet Ball. "I did reprise my role as Victoria couple of times at subsequent Closet Ball contests, and happily turned over my title to my good friend David Murie (Miss Dede Castle) the year after I won."

It was also during these early years that Benjamin ran for the NGRA Board of Directors. He became a Member-At-Large and later was elected as Public Relations Director and then Secretary. "My newsletters at that time weren't awful, but they didn't hold a candle to what NGRA is doing today!" [Editor's note: Thank you, Benjamin!]

"Eventually I was elected NGRA Vice-President, serving with President Ken Carney, Trustee Johann Kristinsson, and others. These two men probably taught me the most about the organization and gave me the foundation to take the next step. In 2001, I was elected president of NGRA. It's simultaneously one of the most challenging and most rewarding things I've ever done, and an honor and privilege I cherish to this day. In fact, although I am a native Texan and am currently living back in Texas, the NGRA honorary lifetime membership bestowed upon me as outgoing president is the only IGRA association membership I hold. NGRA will definitely always be first in my heart when it comes to gay rodeo."

NGRA wasn't the only organization he has given his time to over the years. After attending the IGRA convention in Omaha, he was hooked. He has attended every IGRA convention since July 1996. The first few years, he represented NGRA as a Delegate. Johann assigned him to the IGRA Bylaws and Standing Rules Committee the first year. "I don't know if he (Johann) was a genius or if he just thought I wouldn't know any better, but I definitely found my home." After a few years serving as a Delegate on the committee, IGRA President Linda Frazier asked if he would Co-Chair the committee in 1999, and in 2000, newly elected IGRA President Craig Rouse asked him to Chair the committee individually. Benjamin added with pride, "I'm honored and pleased to have chaired the committee since that time."

In 2003, long-time IGRA Parliamentarian Charley Lanier stepped down. Craig Rouse asked Benjamin if he would be willing to succeed him and Benjamin accepted. "I was stepping into the shoes of a man whom I had looked up to for many years. It was exciting and a bit scary. It's another position in which I've learned a lot, and I really enjoy the work."

Thinking of all his mentors - Gary L'Abbe, Ken Carney, Johann Kristinsson, Charley Lanier, Craig Rouse, current IGRA President Brian Helander, and corporate sponsor representative James Ramey, to name a few. "I am reminded of what the English physicist Isaac Newton said about his discoveries: 'If I have seen further than others, it's because I've stood on the shoulders of giants."

BENJAMIN AVANT (continued): Benjamin can't express how much he has learned from his experience and involvement in NGRA and IGRA. "Of course, I learned a lot about the organizations, gay rodeo, our history, events, and charities. But even more than that, I have grown on a personal level. As a Board Member, I learned what it takes to make a volunteer organization run successfully and how to motivate people to help get things done when their only incentive is their willingness to work with you. I learned how to organize events and develop successful business relationships with sponsors. As Mr. NGRA, I became comfortable hosting events, speaking on the microphone in public, and, yes, walking up to strangers to ask them for money. These skills have become a valuable part of who I am and what I offer in my career. When you read advice on job hunting and writing resumes, they always talk about including volunteer work that you've done. I can say it's unequivocally true. I'm a much stronger person from what the organization has given to me, and I am grateful."

Benjamin moved from Las Vegas back home to Dallas, Texas in 2004. He is currently working for a training and consulting company for the hospitality industry. It's an exciting job with plenty of travel, which is both a good and a bad thing. "We have several clients in Las Vegas, so I get to visit rodeo friends from time to time. When I'm home in Dallas, I love going two-stepping at the Round Up Saloon. I guess you can't take the rodeo out of the boy. I'm pleased to be continuing my work at the IGRA level and it's always nice to see my NGRA family at the IGRA annual convention."

When asked for some parting words for our BigHorn Gazette readers, Benjamin states, "If you've been thinking about getting involved with NGRA, I whole-heartedly encourage you to do so. The rewards can be immeasurable. And if you ever want to hear an old-timer talk about the early days of NGRA, I'm always ready to share a story and a beer." Or a margarita, or shots, or a milkshake... he's not picky!





Welcome readers! This is a new, and will be an ongoing, column for the NGRA BigHorn Gazette called, "Straight from the Horse's..." (mouth). This will be an interview with Cowboys & Cowgirls from across the IGRA Competitive Circuit. We will highlight certain events in rodeo monthly and talk to the riders and their animal counterparts for an in-depth exposé into the world of competing in an IGRA Sanctioned Rodeo. Please join me in welcoming Miss IGRA 2001, Victoria London aka Scott Tickler.

Joel: Today we are joined by the lovely and talented Mr. Tickler. Tickle her? I hardly know her.

Scott: Yeah, I've never heard that one before.

- J: Hello Scott, and thank you so much for making time for our readers today. How long have you been involved in AGRA?
- S: Thank you for having me, Joel. I first got involved with AGRA in 1991.
- J: In what year were you (aka Victoria London) crowned Miss AGRA?
- S: I was actually Miss AGRA twice, in 1993 and then again in 2000. In 2001, I became the third girl from Arizona to be crowned Miss IGRA.
- J: Congratulations! Rumor has it you were an amazing Miss. So tell us, what events do/did you compete in?
- S: Oh, the usual Public Readings, Competitive Barstool Diving, and Mid-Flight Face-Painting. But, for timed events I had to get myself up in drag, and to the rodeo grounds, with a carload of queens, bad directions, and no GPS before Grand Entry started.
- J: Now that's how you separate the boys from the Queens! What got you interested in Rodeo Camp Events?
- S: Oh, honey, I'm a hairy man who wears wigs and dresses for the entertainment of others. I <u>AM</u> a camp event!
- J: I wish my Summer Camps were more like you! So, tell us about the "Martha Washington Race" in Washington, D.C. that you participated in. I heard it was a HOOT!
- S: Lord, how much space do I have? This event is only done at the Atlantic Stampede, because those East Coast people are a special kind of "sick." It's a timed event, and consists of a team of 3 people. Two of the team members have to carry "Martha Washington" through an obstacle course set up to emulate Mrs. W's heroic adventure to save priceless White House treasures during The Revolutionary War. Michael Cunningham (Mr. IGRA 2001) and I carried Minerva Rex (Miss IGRA 2001 1st Runner-Up) through this entire event and managed to resist the urge to drop her on her head! It was a beautiful thing. And we won the event that year!
- J: Congratulations! What are your current rankings in any other IGRA Camp Events? Or, what was your ranking for your best year and which year was it and which events?
- S: In my day (God, I sound old!) the Royalty wasn't required to compete, so some of us didn't. I only competed at one rodeo as a Title Holder. I was there to raise money for the Associations, and to donate my time to make sure that they had an amazing rodeo.
- J: Have you ever buckled in any of these events?
- S: Only the events that I could do on stage in a beaded gown.
- J: I heard that Victoria London actually competed in face once upon a time? I believe it was in Goat Dressing? (Miss London nods in agreement) So, let's focus on Goat Dressing for the remainder of the interview... What is your best time?
- S: Usually mid-afternoon and after a nap.
- J: Well I am sure many of our readers will be taking special note of that information. I am sure you will find many cowfolk lining up ate your door! Do you think Goat Dressing is more difficult for women than men? What about the difficulty level in drag?

- S: I think it's equally difficult for either gender, depending on their personal experience with Y-fronts. I did it in drag, but it was lesbian drag. The sensible shoes were great for the event, but the tool belt kept getting in the way.
- J: Tool belt? Really? I bet it was an orange one from the Homo Depot. How do you practice for this event? It's not like mounted Speed Events I am sure, then again for you it may very well be. Enquiring minds want to know... what's your training regimen?
- S: To be honest, I've had a little more practice taking underwear OFF of something rather than putting it ON, so I'd have to say about 2.5 seconds.
- J: What is the most difficult element? Is it having to use Fruit of the Loom tighty-whities? Do you prefer G-Strings or Jocks? What's the secret to a good dressing?
- S: Personally, I prefer 2Xist. And the secret to a "good dressing" is always to go a little lighter on the balsamic.
- J: Have you ever hit the proverbial wall?
- S: Oh Lord! Yes. As Miss IGRA I was traveling constantly. I was required to do 6 events: 4 rodeos plus convention and Finals the next year. With the help of MANY friends, I went to 26 functions. At one point, I had been out of town 6 weekends in a row. I was so tired when I got back from one of them that I just took my entire suitcase down to my dry cleaners. They cleaned, folded, and repacked the entire thing. But, my wigs were never really the same after that...
- J: Any remaining battle-wounds, or are they all psychological?
- S: I still wake up in the middle of the night having flashbacks to all of the security check points and pat downs. But to be honest, it's the only reason I still fly! J: Ever get fined for a dropped F-Bomb, lost hat, fallen eyelash, Wardrobe Malfunction, etc.?
- S: Are you kidding? I was never fined, but there was always a bet with the other Royalty Team members as to when it would happen. I love the "F" bomb. I learned it from my mother.
- J: I learned it from my Mother too. We must be cousins. So, as most of my friends know, I am engaged to my Goat, but for you, why Goat Dressing? What's the draw? S: I had to do goats.
