


Miss Nobody Pageant June 19th

WORLD GAY RODEO FINALS REPORT

WORLD GAY RODEO FINALS UPDATE By Brian Rogers - 2010 Finals Rodeo Director

As most of you know by now, NGRA has been selected to host the World Gay Rodeo Finals in 2010 and 2011. This monthly article will serve to keep our membership and friends up-to-date on developments as we finalize planning for the event.

Our venues will be the AVI Resort and Casino outside of Laughlin and the Mojave Crossing Events Center just across the river in Arizona.

A lot of people ask **Why Laughlin**? First, IGRA requires Finals Rodeo to be held in a covered arena. Such facilities in Las Vegas are unavailable at a reasonable cost. Additionally, Laughlin is ideally located in the "Golden Triangle" for gay rodeo. Our 4-day event is strategically located with 5-hour drive of the five major gay markets that support heavily-attended local gay rodeos including Las Vegas, Phoenix, Palm Springs, Los Angeles and San Diego.

The World Gay Rodeo Finals is "Your Ultimate Rodeo Vacation". We are planning four days and nights of activities and other associated events plus the actual rodeo. Mark your calendar now and make plans to reserve a room at the AVI for the whole weekend of events.

IGRA produces the World Gay Rodeo Finals with the assistance of NGRA as co-host. This means that NGRA will not have to do a lot of heavy lifting. We will be primarily responsible for:

- Marketing
- Entertainment
- Party and Special Event Coordination
- · Rodeo equipment and backups
- Developing and executing a viable transportation plan
- Providing a volunteer base
- Developing fundraising activities for our designated local charity

Dr. and Mr. Franklin-Sewell vacationed for their honeymoon in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico.







NGRA Featured Member Spotlight

Lorry King, Member Since 2001

NGRA Member Spotlight: Every month we will begin featuring a long-standing member of NGRA and celebrate their contributions to NGRA. This month, may we present Ms. Lorry King, Member since 2001.

Lorry is one of NGRA's finest members and is also a straight ally to our LGBT Community. I had the pleasure of meeting Lorry King a few years back at an NGRA function at Charlie's through Guy Puglisi before I was even a member of NGRA. Without any prodding, she took a liking to me immediately. It was this genuine warmth and special quality that drew me closer to her and created a want to get to know her better. Over the next few years, Lorry, to me, exemplified what NGRA is all about: rodeo, camaraderie, fundraising, education, and having fun.

She had been a member of Golden State Gay Rodeo Association (GSGRA) before moving to Nevada. She tells us, "I joined because of the fact that women could compete in all events, the fact that the profits went to charity, and the dancing!" Competitive Dancing is one of Lorry's greatest passions. She

has taught, judged, and competed in dance. When asked about her fondest memory, she replied, "Winning my first dance buckle in San Diego at the GSGRA Convention in 2000. This meant that I would go on to represent California at the IGRA competition. FYI -- Guy "Porkchop" Puglisi was there to see it!" [Editor's Note: Porkchop was more than a little marinated that evening, but he does remember something about something about Lorry in San Diego. Betty Ford would be proud.]

Lorry's service record and dedication to NGRA is nothing less than amazing with 7 out of 9 years of service. She has served as a Member-at-Large in 2003, Vice-President from 2003-2004, and Trustee from 2005-2007. She also served as Assistant Rodeo Director in 2006 and as Dance, Registration, Awards, Election, and Convention Chair many years. "I have been a Delegate to every IGRA Convention from NGRA from 2002-2009, and Alternate Trustee at 22 rodeos." Lorry has the distinction of performing in several Line Dance Teams, including one that toured through New Zealand - both teaching and performing. "Three were in California. Two were formed by a couple who are well-known choreographers. The first one was for a performance at a national line dance festival, in front of students, instructors and choreographers from around the world. The second team they formed was the one that went to New Zealand. We toured the North Island for two weeks and performed and taught at schools and community centers and once on the street, at a town festival. I was in another team in between those two that was formed by an Instructor for a performance at her dance studio. Then in Las Vegas I was on a team that was formed by one of my Instructors to perform two years in a row at the Meadows Mall."

As one can see, Lorry's contributions are incredible; and her resume is impressive. Ironically, with all this, Lorry has never considered running for IGRA Royalty. Perhaps we can start a Facebook Fan Page to convince her otherwise. After all, it got Betty White on SNL.

Out on the IGRA Rodeo Circuit, Lorry has also served as an Official. She has been Assistant Rodeo Secretary many times and her goals are always the same, "To treat all contestants fairly and to complete my paperwork accurately. I know how hard the contestants work and how important the results are to them. I also want to have fun and make it fun for them!" One has to wonder what it is about NGRA and Rodeo that has made such a long-standing and dedicated member in Lorry. "It's the people! I have made some wonderful friends and have met some people whose dedication to raising money for charity is inspiring!"

As spectators of Rodeo, we all have the events we love to watch. And Lorry is no different. "I love to watch Wild Drag and Flag Racing and my favorite competitor is Christy Cotton from California. Besides being a great competitor, she is one of the nicest people you'll ever meet. She never fails to thank all the Officials and volunteers for their hard work."

Lorry will continue representing NGRA on the circuit. She has been asked to work as Assistant Rodeo Secretary at four additional rodeos. She adds, "Including Finals! Yeah!" She hopes to again serve as a Delegate from NGRA in Reno, and is always happy to serve as an Alternate Trustee when needed. When asked to impart some words to our membership, Lorry said, "Please, please don't forget about our charities! We've chosen some great organizations in the past and in these tough times, our local non-profits need our help more than ever!"



We will highlight certain events in rodeo monthly and talk to the riders and their animal counterparts for an in-depth exposé into the world of competing in an IGRA Sanctioned Rodeo. Please join me in welcoming 2010 IGRA World Finals All-Around Cowboy, David Renier!!



Joel: Hello David. Thank you so much for taking time out of your busy schedule to do this interview! How long have you been involved in Rodeo?

David: I have been participating in the IGRA for 20 years, I started when I was 10 years old LOL.

J: What events do or did you compete in?

D: I have competed in all of the events except Bull and Steer Riding. I did Chute dogging a couple of times and I was no good at it. I even tried Bronc Riding at a rodeo... let's say that the word "*tried*" is the key word. It was very entertaining for my friends.

J: Every competitive Cowboy & Cowgirl wants to qualify to receive their invitation to IGRA World Finals. Have you ever qualified for finals?

D: I have qualified for the IGRA finals every year since I joined.

J: What was your best year on the circuit?

D: This last year, 2009, was probably my best year. I finally won the IGRA AII- Around Cowboy at the finals!

J: Congratulations! Have you ever buckled in any events?

D: I have won many buckles in all of the events that I have competed in. Several hundred. Yes, that is with two zeros. (He says with a coy wink)

J: Now let's talk about your partners in rodeo crime, that is, your horse. Please tell us a little about them.

D: I had the most wonderful horse that I competed on for years named "Bisquit," but he has been retired and is living out his life at my family's ranch. I now have a wonderful horse named "Easy" and he is a 5 year old Brown Quarter Horse Gelding.

J: Hello, Easy. And thank you for joining us this afternoon.

Easy: Thank you for having me. The pleasure is mine I am sure.

J: Easy, when did you and David first pair up?

E: I saw him wandering aimlessly about in Arkansas one day and ...

D: He's such a ham! I bought him in Arkansas last year.

E: He likes to boast that I am already a winner, but truth be told, I am the real winner. We all hope to find a rider who understands us. David makes it easy on Easy!

J: Easy there, Easy. David, it looks as if you have yourself quite a catch. Tell us more about him.

D: He is the most loving horse and willing to do anything. He's like a big dog... he loves to be loved on and nothing rattles him. He doesn't act like your typical young horse.

E: I do love being loved on, how else do you think I earned the name Easy? (Whinnies with laughter and a big smile)

J: Let's focus on Roping

events for the remainder of the interview. You have competed in Calf Roping on Foot and Mounted Break-Away. Tell us about each event.

D: In Calf Roping on Foot, I have roped in less than one second. In Break-Away Roping, I believe it was in 2.4 seconds on my friend Candy Pratt's horse "Rope." He is an amazing rope horse and Easy wants to grow up to be just like him.

E: I do?

J: How did you get started in roping? I know the easier it looks to the spectator, the more skilled the roper.

D: When I was young my uncle was a roper and he taught me how to rope and it was a favorite of mine.

J: Do you think roping is more difficult for men or women?

D: I don't think it matters. Some days the men will out rope the women, but then next day they give us guys a spankin'! There are great men and great women ropers on the circuit.

J: Well said! How do you practice/training regimen for roping?

D: Here in San Diego, my Team Roping partner, Kirk Carter, and I practice almost every week. He is the one that I have won my two Finals Buckles in Team Roping with. Kirk and Candy Pratt are my main Team Roping partners and I wouldn't trade either one of them.

J: What is the most difficult element? Is it the catch, the positioning of the rope over the head, or coordinating with Easy, your hands, and the calf?

D: Well it all has to come together for it to work. First, you want a calf that runs straight and at a good rate of speed. Then comes your horse's position. Then it's up to you. If you don't swing your rope properly and deliver it, you're not going to be able to rope your calf. And then, you want your horse to stop straight and fast because as soon as the rope breaks away from your saddle the time stops.

J: Have you ever hit the proverbial wall?

D: Oh yes it happens to everyone. Some days you can't miss and the next you can't catch a thing. Calf Roping does have some element of luck as well, so you always hope for a little of that when you rope.

J: Are there any remaining battle wounds or are the all psychological?

D: Psychological for sure! (*Both David & Easy laugh*) I will never be the same, but hey, it's a good excuse for not being too bright. I have hit my head way too many times. As far as battle wounds - I have dislocated my shoulder, broken my collar bone, had several surgeries on my knees, cracked my shin bone, and been knocked unconscious. Oh and broke my finger... but heck, who's counting?

D: No. Like I said, I have done most of them and if you ever see me on a Bull you know that I have hit my head one too many times. If you ever see me on one, could you please just come get me off of it? It won't end well I'm sure. No need to add things to my injury list.

E: And I prefer the events where I get to play too. Those bulls don't play well with others.

J: What is your goal for the 2010 IGRA Circuit Year?

D: Well I'm hoping to repeat 2009 and win the All-Around Cowboy Award. There are so many great cowboys competing that it's never an easy thing to do. (*Easy slightly coughs*)Also, get some Championship buckles won on my great new horse Easy, but I know that will happen. J: Who is your favorite Rodeo Competitor, both IGRA and Non-IGRA?

D: I would have to say there are two competitors that I look up to. I have known and competed with Candy Pratt for most of my rodeo career. She has always been there for me and we have won a lot together. The other would be my rodeo partner Kirk Carter. Through the years he has been my main partner and we have really done well together. They are both great competitors and have many Championships under their belts and I couldn't have achieved a lot of what I have without them. Oh, and a special shout out to my husband, Nick, and his new horse Okie. Thank you for being there and your support. I love you.

J: Any last parting words of wisdom for our readers?

D: If you're going to ride: check your cinch, sit up straight, and go fast! If you're just coming to watch and support us... thank you, drink lots of beer and have a blast!!

E: And, if you see David out tonight buy him a beer. He rodeos better with a hangover!
