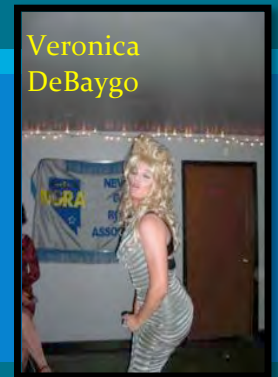

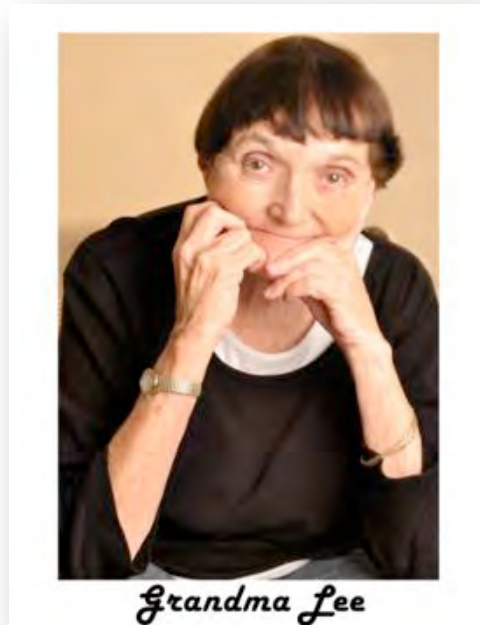

For the first time since her "America's Got Talent" debut, fans have the opportunity to catch Grandma Lee in a headlining role, uncensored and uncut, opening for The Carter Twins.

Most recently, Lee won the hearts of millions and made it all the way to the grand finale on NBC's "America's Got Talent," making it her personal goal to help older people realize it's never too late to follow your dreams and laugh. She also just finished appearing in "America's Got Talent Live" hosted by Jerry Springer at Planet Hollywood in Las Vegas. The sassy senior won the 2003 Las Vegas Comedy Festival at the MGM Grand and was chosen as a finalist for the 2004 season of NBC's "Last Comic Standing." 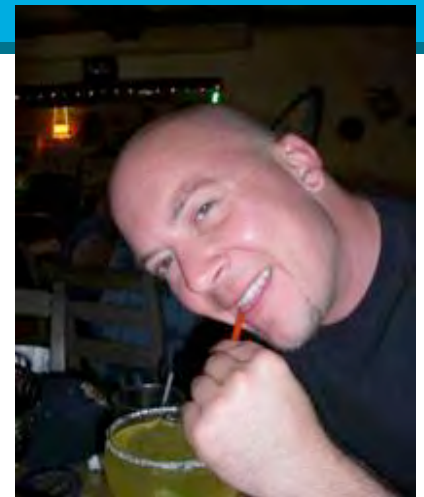

The Carter Twins Headline World Gay Rodeo Finals by Joel Castillo

You may have heard them on the airways of country radio. Perhaps you've seen them featured in PEOPLE Magazine. You may have watched them on CMT. And now, you will get to know a little more about the up and coming Country Artists, The Carter Twins. These two fun and dynamic young men have a wicked sense of humor. When asked if they are identical or fraternal, Josh replied, "We are identical... I think... we never really found out but we say we are. We just cut our hair the same and people can't tell the difference... so, identical it is! Ha!"

Josh and Zach Carter made it to the heart of Country Music known as Nashville via their childhood in Akron, Ohio, and then Hilton Head, South Carolina. Or as Zach puts it, "by car... just kidding. No, we actually got singed to CMT half-way through our senior year in high school, we were living in South Carolina then. When we graduated, we move to Nashville three days later and started writing our album. Crazy but so fun!" Listed among their musical influences are a hodge-podge of music genres like Keith Urban, George Strait, John Mayer, Brooks & Dunn, Garth Brooks and many more. Josh adds, "We are influenced by so many artists that it's hard to narrow it down."

Their mother worked in Country Radio and encouraged their musical interests. Zach stole time at her piano, "I would always take to it, write my own songs, and play for hours. I knew right away that music is what I wanted to do." Meanwhile, she taught Josh the Classic Rock hit "Stairway to Heaven" on the guitar and he has not put it down since.

The Carter Twins will be taking the Rockstar Main Stage by storm at the IGRA World Gay Rodeo Finals at the AVI Resort in Laughlin, Nevada on Saturday, October 23, 2010 at 8:00 PM. This is not the Twins' first time at the rodeo. They performed at NFR last year in Las Vegas. "It was a blast," Josh said enthusiastically. When asked about their GLBT Fans, Josh said, "We've had lots of gay fans at our shows and hopefully they will come out and see us in Vegas too! We're always really excited to meet fans - whether it's somebody new or a familiar face!" Zach adds, "You know, the cool thing about music is that it is universal.. it crosses all social borders. We are just a country band playing country music and we hope everyone likes what they hear!"

And we do. Their first single "Heart Like Memphis" has been well received on the charts. Their EP is available for download in iTunes and is worth every penny. I took a listen and I love it. I found a nice balance of melody, hook, and a beautiful harmonization of their voices. They loved hearing that review and Zach added, "We are so glad that fans took to it and liked it and made YouTube videos and fan pages and all different kinds of things. Such a cool thing. We are so blessed to have such great fans. We love all of them!"

Their follow-up smash "So What" has been released... accidentally. Josh said, "Well, we actually only released "So What" as a fan video on CMT about a year ago." Zach added, "We never really planned on it being a single or anything like that, we just wanted to make a fun video that catered to the fans. But, it did actually get played on radio a bit so we were excited!" Rounding out the Carter Twins EP are "Wish I Would've Kissed Her" and "Photo Booth."

Still settling into their new digs, Josh & Zach spent the summer months working with some of Music City's best songwriters and crafting as many as 30 songs in just three months. Under the helm of Frank Rogers, Billboard Magazine's #1 Country Music Producer, The Carter Twins are working hard on their debut full-length album. Josh continues, "We are still writing and recording the album now, so we don't have a release date yet. But, we will let you know as soon as we do!"

When asked about IGRA's popular Camp Events like Wild Drag, Steer Decorating, and the crowd-favorite Goat Dressing, the Twins said, "We have not seen those events before! I bet those events are definitely entertaining though! Guess we'll get to see it in October. We wish everyone the best of luck in each of their categories. And as for the aspiring musicians out there, we always say, play out as much as you can, in front of everyone... like they say, you never know who's listening! We happened to experience that first hand."

Joel: Hello Kip. And thank you so much for taking time out for our readers! It is indeed an honor. When did you first join NGRA?

Kip: I joined in 1992. I was there at the founder's first meeting.

J: Amazing! Talk about getting a real-live account of how it all began. What drew you to join?

K: It was my Gary (L' Abbe). He was one of the founding members and I went along for the ride. And what a wild ride!

J: With so many options I am sure, what is your fondest memory?

K: The 1992 Miss IGRA Finals in Phoenix. We rocked that town. To this day anyone who was there will say that was the best rodeo they have ever been to. The road trip, the experience, and, of course, the "how many Brian's does it take to make a cup of coffee?". I miss them both so much and poor Art with the swimsuit. So many memories and so many smiles! Oh, and meeting Rob from New Mexico, and David from California, and my Tony. He was so stressed out that he took me to his room where he had liquor on ice in the bathtub... that's my kinda man. Then there was the power going off and the hotel telling us that we need to stop using so many hair driers at the same time.

J: Sounds like I missed a hell of a party! Have you ever served NGRA? If so, in what capacity and during which years?

K: I was the first Miss NGRA and was Fundraising Chair for the first few years

J: What was NGRA like in its infancy and early beginnings?

K: It was a challenge, but what a fun experience. Baby steps at first. But, we got rodeo back in Nevada. We originally went into convention to join as Southern Nevada Gay Rodeo Association so not to take away from Reno but were told that no we would be Nevada Gay Rodeo Association so we were accepted as that. I still remember that first board meeting. Bob Michaels as President. Gary L' Abbe as Vice President. Kevin Hall as Secretary. Art McGee as Treasurer. And Ken Carney as Trustee. Members at Large not too sure but remember Tom Blythe, Robert Kingham and, I think, Tom Tyre. I'm old ya know. And another... I forgot to mention Roxie Hart. My drag mom. Gotta have her in there!

J: You're not old, you are seasoned, my darling! Tell us about your experience as our first Miss NGRA 1992-1993.

K: Just call me the Grande Dame (and that's pronounced Dom) Kidding.

J: Like the champagne!

K: (Laughs) Yes. It was me, Billy Dee as my Mister, and Patti Holden as my Ms. Alexis Michaels was my first runner up, George Vierra and Kurtis Veater were the Mister runner-ups.

J: Wow! What an amazing line-up! What have you been up to in your time away?

K: I've been trying to get my life back together. When Gary died I lost such a big part of me. But, we had talked and said if anything happened to either of us we could mourn for 90 days and that was it. Then go on with your life. 90 days to the day of Gary's services I met Wil. He was sent to me. He joined for a while, but was always talked down to saying he was using me and such; which he wasn't. I know two of the three people that totally

person he was. Am I bitter? HELL YES! How dare anyone tell me how to live my life!

J: I am saddened to hear that. So tell us, what is it about NGRA that has made a long-standing member of you?

K: Just the rodeo standard and to try and keep Gary's dream alive. He wanted to be involved so much and I still remember the smile on his face through all the stress. The phone call from Lo Jones when the steers got loose and she was chasing them to get back into the pen. Now that is real rodeo! And when the bull jumped over the fence and went after the ambulance. 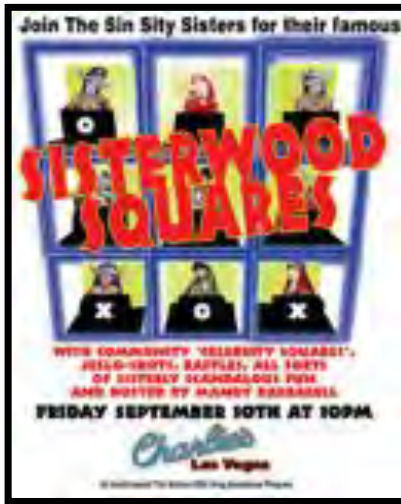

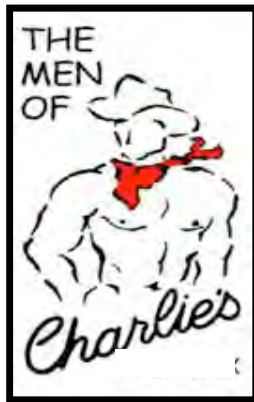
