



Brief life history

I was born in Buffalo, New York and have lived in Las Vegas since I was three. I graduated from Valley High School and later completed my BSBA at University of Phoenix. I have worked in human services for almost 14 years and have been volunteering for our community since I was 19 and always try to do my part to build or help our community. My primary focuses are NGRA (as a board member), IGRA (as a certified official and board member) and The Men of Charlie's (as one of the contest coordinators).
