It was a happy time because we finally had our organization as we hoped we would have. After I won Miss NGRA we went to Phoenix for the IGRA finals. Our first year in the organization and we had almost 100 people attending from Las Vegas. Not for the hope of being recognized (well maybe a little) but just to be accepted. We were accepted and I thank my friends for that. 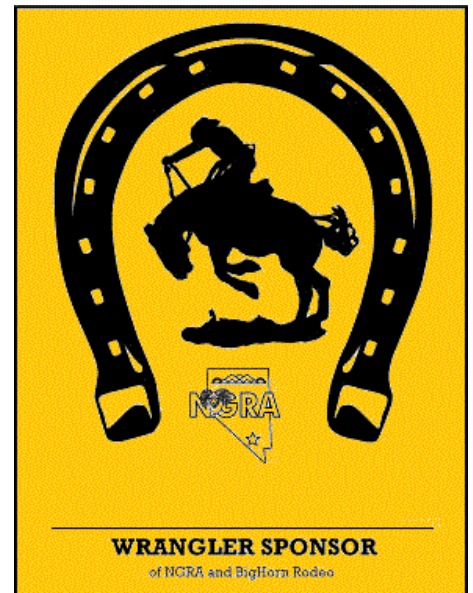
