Planning Begins for BigHorn Rodeo 2017



That's right. I said 2017. In the July meeting, the Board of Directors voted to not submit the required forms for a 2016 Rodeo and instead spend our efforts reworking the NGRA Rodeo format. Rodeos have always been expensive but, over the last few years, they've become even more costly. The cost of the rodeo, coupled with the limited resources of our sponsors makes it even more difficult. The Board could have easily voted to have a Rodeo in 2016 and I have no doubt it would have been a great time and everybody would have had a lot of fun. The problem is that it probably wouldn't have been the money maker that previous rodeos have been. It's not that NGRA is trying to build up its bank account, just the opposite-remember, we're a non-profit organization, which means most of the money we earn, from monthly fundraisers, rodeo, etc. goes back into the community. The money that doesn't go into the community goes to cover overheads (fees, insurance, operating expenses, etc.). While I'm talking about money, now seems like a good time to remind you that all of NGRA's volunteers are just that—volunteers. Nobody working for NGRA is a paid employee—we're all volunteers. Ok, back to rodeo talk. NGRA could have very easily produced a Rodeo in 2016 that would have been very similar to our 2015 rodeo, which was similar to our 2014 rodeo, which was similar to our 2013 rodeo—you get the picture. The Board decided that now is the time to try something different so we're going to spend 2016 reworking our rodeo program. Maybe we'll find a different venue. Maybe we'll find additional sponsors or a different format all together. The point is that it's easy to do the same thing over and over again. It takes time, effort, and planning to change things up, which is why the Board voted to not submit the 2016 forms. Rest assured, this isn't the end of NGRA. We're still having monthly fundraisers, we're still out in the community and we're still raising money to give back to others. The only thing that changes is rodeo planning. Instead of planning for BigHorn 2016, we've started planning for BigHorn 2017.

Roger Bergmann

Roger Bergmann was born and raised in Kalispell, Montana. Though he lived in a city, he loved going to the annual County Fair, where he began going to rodeos while still in grade school. At about the age of 10, Roger would sneak across the race track to the holding pens where he would walk the top of the fences between the bucking horses and the bulls. Then he would watch the rodeo from the contestant area right above the bucking chutes, and eventually jump into the pens to help sort the roping calves into the proper running order.

After college, Roger moved to Bishop, California at the age of 22. In 1980 he began attending the "National Reno Gay Rodeo". While at the Reno Rodeo in 1983, Roger met Al Bell and Pat McGrath who were getting ready to open "Floyd's Bar" in Long Beach, California.


Al and Pat were two of the Founding Members of the Golden State Gay Rodeo Association (GSGRA), and it wasn't long before they had Roger signed up as a Charter Member in 1985.

At the 2nd Annual GSGRA rodeo (LA Rodeo '86), Roger noticed a sign-up sheet for people interested in becoming certified as a rodeo judge for the International Gay Rodeo Association (IGRA). Under the guidance of Casey Jackson, Roger was soon certified and judged his first IGRA rodeo at Dallas, Texas in November, 1986.



Roger Bergmann as a Rodeo Judge - Sometime & Somewhere


It was around this time that Roger also became active as a contestant at some of the rodeos around the IGRA circuit.

Roger was a Certified Rodeo Judge for over 16 years. He was the Chairperson of the Judges Certification Committee from 1987 to 1991, and in 1988 he attended a Professional Rodeo Cowboy Association judges training in order to improve his own judging skills and techniques for training others. After moving to the Los Angeles area in 1989, Roger became more involved with the Greater Los Angeles Chapter of GSGRA. He was a Chapter Representative on the GSGRA State Board of Directors in 1992 and '93, and a Trustee on the State Board of Directors in 1996. Roger was Rodeo Director for "LA Rodeo '92", '98, 2002 and 2003; and was Assistant Rodeo Director for the '93, '94, '95, and '96 rodeo productions. Roger was also one of the Rodeo Judges for the first three Palm Springs Regional Rodeos which were held in 1993, '94, and '95. Roger served as the 6th IGRA President for three terms in 1993, '94, and '95.

In 2007, Roger was inducted into the IGRA Hall of Fame, and he has been Chairperson of the Hall of Fame selection committee since 2011. As Chairman, Roger soon realized that finding historical information regarding the many individuals who have been involved with IGRA activities for the past 30 years was extremely difficult. The IGRA Secretaries have kept an ongoing record of everyone who has received an IGRA Award. Most, but not all, members of the IGRA Royalty Teams have been identified. But there has been no list of IGRA Committee Chairs or Certified Officials. Beginning in 2012, Roger began going through the archived IGRA Board and Convention Minutes to compile that information. There are still some gaps in the data, but Roger has completed what he can do with the information available. The list for IGRA Committee Chairs and IGRA Certified Officials is already available at: www.gayrodeohistory.org. In the very near future, multiple documents will be available online at www.gayrodeohistory.org. The listing of "Individual's IGRA Awards and Non-Monetary Contributions to IGRA" has been compiled for each IGRA Member Association, including those Associations that have dissolved over the years. These Member Association lists help to preserve the history of IGRA, and will be a resource of information when considering individuals to nominate for induction into the IGRA Hall of Fame.

In August 2012, Roger moved from Pomona, California to Las Vegas. Roger already knew a number of NGRA members from his involvement with GSGRA and IGRA. Roger was one of the Rodeo Judges for the "BigHorn Rodeo" in 1996, 1997, 1999, and 2000. In 2013 Roger worked as the Rodeo Sponsorship Chair, but cut back on rodeo work in 2013; though he still volunteered to help out rodeo weekend.

Roger states: "The International Gay Rodeo Association has been in existence since September, 1985. It has survived all these years because of the hard work of many dedicated individuals. Rodeos exist because of the many men and women contestants who want to enjoy the action of the events and the camaraderie of others. But the rodeos would not occur without the support of the many volunteers who help bring it all together, and the spectators who come to enjoy all of the festivities."

Roger's activity in gay rodeo has never been slowed by the fact that he has never owned a horse, so if you would like to become an active participant in gay rodeo, don't hesitate any longer!!

Trustee's News

IGRA BOD Meeting - Santa Fe - August 14, 2015

Bruce Gros, President

Andrew Goodman has been appointed to assume the duties of the IGRA-University chairperson.

There is currently no bid for IGRA Convention for 2016 or 2017. Proposals to host these events are due no later than September 15th; proposals may also be taken from the floor at Convention.

When proposing changes to the bylaws, standing rules, or rodeo rules, Bruce is asking delegates to consider if the proposals build or burden the association. If there is a financial impact by a proposal, it needs to be presented to the Budget Committee ahead of time. Language needs to be run through the proper channels ahead of time to make sure we do not have fragments with consequences going forward. Proposals should be sent to the respective committee chairs and copied to the IGRA Secretary no later than 60 days before (September 15th) IGRA Convention. Benjamin Avant is the Bylaws Chairperson and Clint Coil is the Rodeo Rules Chairperson.

There are two upcoming vacancies on the IGRA BOD this year: Vice President and Secretary.

WGRF is IGRA's only rodeo. As hosts, the board needs to make an effort to be present and support this event. Bruce encouraged members and associations to find ways to support this event financially as well, where possible. Sponsorships are available for as little as \$100.

Bruce would like to earmark monies for education next year to grow, uplift, and support gay rodeo. Our non-rodeo-producing rodeos will outnumber our rodeo-producing associations.

James Jenkins, Vice President

Nine associations did not provide judges for the IGRA Royalty Competition and will be fined if names are not presented by the 16th. NGRA submitted its judges well in advance of the deadline and is not impacted. There are 12 contestants total: 5 for Mister; 3 for Miss; 2 for Ms.; and 2 for MsTer.

Registration will be on Thursday and the competition will be all day on Friday. Step-downs and crowning will take place on Saturday night.

James will not be available between September 7th and 20th.

Due to personal reasons, Alotta Trash, Miss IGRA FRU, has stepped down.

Pierre Cadieux, Secretary

The Rodeo Director for WGRF 2016 is Laura Scott; first assistant is Lisa Smith; and Judy Munson is second assistant. Robin Cagle was appointed as a director at large and the last director at large will be selected by the EBOD on September 16th during their monthly conference call.

The winner of the Wayne Jakino award is Jerry Cunningham from CGRA; the award presentation will take place at WGRF in Las Vegas.

Membership renewals are due by September 15th; untimely applicants will be fined \$200.

David Hill, Treasurer

The budget was discussed. A report from the IGRA Corporate Auditor, Ed Barry, was received and had no citations.

Tommy Channel, IGRA Administrative Assistant

Tommy reminded associations to make sure they get their additional insured information to him so it can be included on the liability insurance riders for each rodeo.

Miscellaneous

The IGRA Royalty has met all of its requirements.

IGRA still needs a Marketing Chairperson. Associations are encouraged to provide members for the various committees. Those interested should contact the respective committee chairpersons. If members are unsure who to contact or have any questions, they can contact their trustee.

Associations are encouraged to get invitations out to their officials as soon as possible for planning purposes. Also, associations need to specifically invite their Head Judges.

There are currently no members of IGRA in not good standing.

Rodeos for AGRA, CGRA, GSGRA (Palm Springs), and TGRA (Dallas) were approved.

IGRA BOD meetings for the first three quarters of 2016 will be held as follows: Tucson (January), Palm Springs (May), and Denver (July). The last meeting of the year will coincide with IGRA Convention once a location is selected.

International, Media, and Website Awards were selected by secret ballot.

A discussion ensued about the social media outlets that IGRA is not currently taking advantage of (e.g. Twitter, Instagram, Snapchat, etc.).

Robert Thurtell suggested we look at the requirements in the Standing Rules regarding the requirement for a membership association to have hosted a rodeo prior to WGRF being hosted in its geographical area.

WGRF Committee

Sponsorship is currently at \$42,500. There are currently 530 room nights booked at South Point. September 18th is the drop-dead date for the special rate. Horse check in will be from 8 am to 8 pm on Thursday and Friday. IGRA has an open contract for the second weekend in October that requires

notification by either party no later than January 1st of each year if finals will be held there in the current year.

There is a Thursday night kick-off party/bus crawl for \$10; those going are encouraged to wear the WGRF tee shirt or Gay Games shirts with a hat to make our presence known. There will be an awards banquet for \$10 on Sunday.

The current income projection is \$27,000. There are seven buckles available for sponsorship, which are available for \$300 and medal sponsorships for \$100 per event, per day. Associations are being challenged to sponsor one or two sets or medals. There are also two buckle sponsorships available for the IGRA Royalty Competition at \$200 each.

Grand Marshals for WGRF are: Brian Rogers, Jim Mc Michaels (Community Hero), Caitlyn Jenner (Honorary).
